Selling of Chametz

Traditionally, any Chametz (leavened foodstuffs like whiskey or pasta) not consumed, burned or otherwise disposed of prior to Pesach is put in a sealed cabinet. It must be "sold" in a ritual fashion to a non-Jew. Rabbi Richard Perlman will serve as your agent for the sale so that it may be carried out according to Jewish law. There is no charge for this service, but a donation for Maot Hittim (food for the poor) is traditional.

Funds collected from the selling of Chametz will be donated to the following:

Family Promise

Since May of 2013, Family Promise has worked on the North Shore to find housing for families and help them get back on their feet. Family Promise works intensively with a small number of families at a time, dedicating many hours per week to ensure each family has the services they need to be successful. Children are able to continue their usual school routine and remain in their normal school system, providing them with a sense of stability during this time of transition for their family. None of the families that have "graduated" from the program have experienced homelessness again.

It is best known for standing up against hate.
