The toy drive supports many organizations that support in need or at-risk youth working with more than 20 non-profits and agencies, including Ventura County Sheriffs Office's Safe Passage program, the Ventura County Medical Center and the Family Justice Center.

The Fire Departments of Ventura County have teamed up with residents, businesses and organizations to ensure that the more than 9,000 children in-need will have a season to remember.
