Dr. Sealy has dual nationalities, he is both a Barbadian, with “Bajan” parents and having grown up in Barbados, and he was born in Edmonton, Canada in 1962. He gained his first degree in chemical engineering from McGill University and his M. Sc. and Ph.D. from Brunel University and the University of Liverpool respectively.

He is a consultant with over 25 years of experience as a project manager, a professional engineer, an environmental scientist and a university lecturer.

He has worked in the civil service, in the private sector and in academia. He is currently a Special Envoy of the Government of Barbados for climate change and a lecturer within the Centre for Resource Management and Environmental Studies at the University of the West Indies. In the private sector, he has worked for Intel (Bdos. Ltd.) and was the regional manager for Stantec (a large Canada-based engineering firm).

Since 2007, Dr. Sealy has served as a senior negotiator for the AOSIS Climate Change Technical Negotiating Team under the UNFCCC process, specialising in mitigation and carbon markets. He is the former Director of the Environmental and Occupational Health Track in the Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in the School of Medicine at St. George’s University in Grenada

Dr. Sealy served as a Member of the Executive Board of the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) since January 2008 and as its Chair from 2014 – 2015.
