Youth Overcoming Life Obstacles (YOLO) is a youth transition program of the Center for Independent Living Options, Inc. (CILO). YOLO is a free, five week (June-July) inclusive community-based program dedicated to empowering and preparing transition-age youth with disabilities for a successful and interdependent life. Since 2013, this program has provided a safe and meaningful summer experience for students who may not otherwise have social and recreational opportunities. This part-time (15 hours per week) position is an excellent opportunity for a person pursuing a special education degree.

Position Description

- Work as one of two co-instructors along with two interns to facilitate activities, interactive conversation and projects that promote independence to 15 students with a variety of disabilities between the ages of 15 and 21 years.
- Work with a team to coordinate daily activities including presenters and trips into the community with the students.
- Must be able to appreciate the uniqueness of each student and recognize their specific strengths.
- This position requires patience and critical thinking.
- Must exhibit self-assurance with co-workers, students and parents/guardians.

Qualifications:

- Prior experience working with youth with disabilities
- Ability to provide leadership & command attention
- Use of personal cell phone for staff communication
- Must have reliable transportation
- Must be on-time and present for each scheduled work-day

- Must be available for orientation during the week of June 1st
- Must agree to criminal background check and drug test

Work Days/Hours:

- YOLO is held each Tuesday and Thursday, June 9 through July 16.
- Work hours - 8:30AM to 3:30PM
