

The Octopus Ultra Journey is 100 Miles

The third annual **Vero Beach Octopus Ultra** is happening on July 14 through July 16th and race proceeds will benefit **The Villages of Armenia** addiction recovery. The 2023 event has several distance options for new and experienced ultra-runners. With a central home base at the Environmental Learning Center, runners will go out and back two, three, four, five, or eight times to complete their chosen distance from a Marathon (26.2 Miles) to 100 Miles. The course will take runners through parks, and trails and onto the beaches of Indian River County. The cut-off to earn the **Octopus Buckle** is to complete all eight arms in 32 hours.

The top finisher in 2022, Louis Cocco, completed the 100-mile distance in 23 hours and 32 minutes. Twelve people earned the Octopus Ultra buckles by completing the course in less than 32 hours.
