

Tuberculosis Symptom Employee Screening

Symptoms of [TB disease](#) depend on where in the body the TB bacteria are growing. TB bacteria usually grow in the lungs (pulmonary TB). TB disease in the lungs may cause cough, chest pain, and coughing up blood.

The following is a symptom review tool for employee screening that would indicate if further medical evaluation is needed. Do you currently have any of the following symptoms?
