A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. (Philippians 1.3-4)

As many of you are aware by now, at the NC Synod Assembly on May 31 I was elected to serve as the next Bishop of the North Carolina Synod. This is a huge honor and a genuine call. As bittersweet as it is, however, this new call means that I will no longer serve as your pastor at Holy Trinity. I am resigning my call effective July 31, though my last Sunday at Holy Trinity will be July 13. This timeframe will allow me to use some vacation time to focus on the transition and also to attend the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, AZ in July.

Some of highlights of my eight years with you include Sunday morning worship, our mission trip to our companion synod in Costa Rica, the months we spent worshiping in Corky Ingram Hall while our boiler was being replaced, weathering the pandemic together, forming a youth group, establishing our core values, engaging in antiracism training, walking with you in the Pride parade, overseeing the start of a food pantry and the Room in the Inn program, and numerous baptisms, funerals, weddings, and confirmations.

In early May, we invited you to share your thoughts on the social issues that matter most to you so that your input can help guide our church's outreach, education, and advocacy efforts as we seek to be Christ's hands and feet in the world. The response was terrific, with 43 respondents to the survey. The Top 3 Issues selected were:

LGBTQ+ Inclusion and Rights

2) Poverty/Homelessness tied with Hunger/Food Insecurity - based on comments, many felt these were hand in hand

3) Racial justice and reconciliation

The great news is that our current service ministries and priorities support these issues well, from celebrating Pride in August, our 2x a week Food Pantry and hosting the NC African Descent Lutheran Association anti-racism training in February.

However, we can do more. The council will host brainstorming sessions in the next several months to identify actionable steps to support these social issues. Stay tuned for more.

We would like to invite you and members of your faith group to the annual Charlotte Pride Interfaith celebration on August 10, 2025, at 4:00 pm.

The Unitarian Universalist Community of Charlotte, at 234 North Sharon Amity Road in Charlotte, will host this



year's service. It will last about an hour and will be followed by an after-service social and refreshments.

This service brings together the LGBTQIA+ community and different faith groups to reflect, celebrate, and build relations. Additionally, this celebration initiates Pride Week in Charlotte, culminating in the festival and parade the following weekend.
