Wear Orange Day



On Sunday Oct. 12, we will be wearing orange and taking time to acknowledge our Native American brothers and sisters. Wearing orange helps us remember the generations of children torn from their families and sent to residential boarding schools, creating trauma for them and future generations. Residential schools were places that attempted to erase Indigenous identity and culture, operating in the US from the late 1800s to the mid-20th century. Tragically, a 2024 report from the US Department of the Interior reported that at least 973 children actually died while attending Indigenous boarding schools. By wearing orange, we're reminded of the story of Phyllis Webstad, a member of the Canoe Creek

Indian Band, just six years old and excited to start school. She wore a brand-new, bright orange shirt that her grandmother gave her. When she arrived at the residential school, her shirt was stripped from her and replaced with the standard residential school uniform, never to be returned. Wearing orange also reminds us that Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is located on the original and ancestral homelands of the Catawba and Sugaree Peoples. We will begin service on October 12 with a Land Acknowledgement during our announcements, followed by a Call to Worship from the ELCA American Indian/Alaska Native Lutheran Association Liturgy "Indigenous People's Celebration: A Service of Indigenous People." For those that do not have orange apparel, orange ribbons will be available to wear.

Blessings of The Animals and Blessings for Children!
Drop-In: October 4, 2025, 8 – 11 am



We will be offering free Animal Blessings for the neighborhood as well as members and friends. This is done as a drop-in service, with Pastor Carolyn and volunteers available in the large church parking lot in front of the church office. *If you'd like to participate and bless animals, you are welcome to do so.*You are also welcome to bring any animal you want blessed. Since there are a lot of youngsters in strollers in the neighborhood, we will also offer blessings for children.

Animal blessings are often associated with St. Francis of Assisi, a catholic monk who emphasized our relationship with all creatures. He called creatures his brothers and sisters, and believed that God loved the animals just as God loved humankind. There is a story that St. Francis did the first blessing of animals when he was wandering outside the city. At the time, he was full of doubt and asking God if everything he had done with his life up to that point was wrong, as he had not listened to his earthly father when he was advised to get married and raise a family. As he walked and prayed, Francis saw some birds along the path and started talking to them as equals. He began "preaching" to them about God and all the reasons why birds and humans should be thankful. This event was considered to be the "first blessing of animals" provided by St. Francis.

Room In The Inn (RITI) is coming back again this December through March. We are hoping to host 8 people for 8 nights (2 nights per month). There are so many ways to support our community, both locally and beyond. This outreach program is special to me because it provides an opportunity to spend time and make personal connections with our guests. If you are interested in contributing, whether organizing, cooking/serving, being present to share a meal, sleeping over, or if you are not sure how to best match your gifts with this ministry, please reach out to me (caroline.coor@gmail.com). Room In The Inn is a Roof Above program that provides emergency winter shelter during the winter months. (December-March)

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The basic goal is to provide shelter and food for the homeless to keep them from freezing on cold winter nights. We expand that goal to include offering a loving relationship between individuals experiencing homelessness and the individuals at the host site. The person may come into the program feeling the label of homeless, but through this program their "label" is transformed into neighbors.



HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

Neighbors are registered and checked in at the Day Ser (945 N College St) each evening starting at 4:30. Assignment priorities are families with children, single women and then men.

Hosts provide transportation to pick up the Neighbors to take them to the host site. The host site becomes their home for the night where they are welcomed with a hot meal, an opportunity for social time, and the assurance they have a safe warm place to get some much-needed rest. Morning comes early and neighbors wake up to breakfast and transportation back uptown to the Charlotte Transit Center/or Day Services Center.
