## A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

What is confirmation?

On June 8— Pentecost Sunday—we will celebrate the confirmation of Jadon Roger and Jonas Jay through the rite of Affirmation of Baptism. We haven't celebrated confirmation at Holy Trinity since Ryan Schang was confirmed in 2019. Whether or not you grew up in a faith tradition where confirmation was the norm, you might want (or need) a reminder of what it is that's happening at confirmation.

The word confirmation actually refers to faith formation. When our youth are in the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades, they participate in classes designed to help them explore their faith. These classes cover topics related to the Bible, theology, and Lutheran history and they culminate in the rite of confirmation, or Affirmation of Baptism.

Affirmation of Baptism connects very closely to the sacrament of baptism. Because as Lutherans we baptize infants, parents typically make promises on behalf of their children. When those children are old enough and ready, they then assume the baptism responsibilities for themselves.

On June 8, Jadon and Jonas will promise to "continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism," a covenant that includes the following promises: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth." Jadon, Jonas, and I have discussed these promises and they are ready to assume responsibility for them!

### A special thank you from Roof Above and Room In The Inn\*

Dear Hosts and Volunteers Extraordinaire,

It's hard to believe we completed our RITI season for 2024-25 one month ago. The InnKeepers (Cher & Jayne) cannot begin to express their deep gratitude for all you have done to make a 'home' for our neighbors. In the event you missed the last email, heed InnKeeper Barto's words: 'Our neighbors' hearts melted when you looked them in the eye and shared your time. None of us know the next path a neighbor will take, but you, dear host, opened your heart and gave them hope. You gave them a home.'

Neighbors using Room In the Inn this season ranged in age from eight months to 76 years old; a snapshot of those unhoused in our community. As affordable housing continues to be out of reach for so many, we are seeing increased numbers of families. This year we had many 'non-traditional' families, including: a grandmother with her special needs grandson, a deaf/blind neighbor with her caretaker nephew, a mother with her adult son with autism, a great aunt with her teenage niece. We had five families with male children over twelve years who stayed with us the majority of the season.

Thank you for providing space for the other and the hundreds of volunteers who make beds, meals, shuttle laundry, neighbors, and take care of our neighbor's physical needs. These acts of kindness and direct support are the foundation of what is needed for neighbors who do not have housing. You also listen to the stories. People who live on the streets do not get a lot of people who look them in the eyes, listen to their stories, or listen to them at all. With your hospitality, our neighbors feel safe and experience a feeling of belonging. They experience sanctuary. We are incredibly grateful for the opportunity to serve as InnKeepers for a second year. It is a privilege to work with such a wonderful and supportive team. We are honored to call ourselves the 'InnKeepers'.

Thank you for walking with our neighbors and ensuring they do not walk alone, if only for one night. (We)will leave you with this-
