AHSP - Alcohol Highway Safety Program-this track was developed for DUI Instructors, CRN Evaluators, Probation Officers and Treatment & Prevention Providers.

DRE-Drug Recognition Expert - this track is exclusively for certified Drug Recognition Experts.

LE-Law Enforcement - this track was developed for Law Enforcement professionals.

Workshop Descriptions

Why Call a DRE? - *Presenter:* Dave Andrascik, DRE, PA DRE State Coordinator, PA DUI Association: This session will focus on the advantages to calling a DRE to evaluate a suspected impaired driver. Participants will understand the advantages to utilizing the expertise of a DRE. *Law Enforcement Track*

Vehicle Search and Seizure - Presenter: Ande Gonzalez, DRE, Lancaster County, Assistant District Attorney: This presentation is focused on the types of search and seizure issues that law enforcement officers face on a daily basis. Vehicle searches are common and are conducted by highly trained police officers as well as brand new patrol officers. The topics covered in this course will include Pennsylvania's Automobile Exception, Canine Searches, Consent Searches, Plain View, Inventory Searches, Terry Frisks, Search Incident to Arrest, and Search Warrants. No matter your level of training and experience, this course will provide you direction to handle a vehicle search in any given situation. Participation from the attendees is encouraged. Law Enforcement Track

Law Enforcement & Community Relations - *Presenter*: Corporal John Witkowski, DRE, PA State Police: Police/violator conversations are vital to public perceptions of police officers in general. Improvement in communication improves the outcome of the encounter. This session will provide officers a better understanding on how to become effective communicators with the public. *Law Enforcement Track*

DRE National Perspective & State Updates - *Presenter:* **Dave Andrascik, PA DRE State Coordinator:** The Pennsylvania DRE Coordinator will discuss the Drug Evaluation and Classification
Program growth, throughout the world, the country and here in Pennsylvania. He will discuss recent DRE case law, as well as statistical numbers, and program curriculum updates. *DRE Track*

DRE Expert Panel - *Moderator:* Cpl. John Witkowski, DRE, Pennsylvania State Police, *Presenters:* Craig Amos, DRE, Regional DUI Program Administrator, PA DUI Association, Toxicologist (to be announced) and Prosecuting Attorney (to be announced)- This session will focus on providing key updates to DREs and welcome participant questions and input. *DRE Track*

DRE Instructor Supervised Evaluations (Recertification) - *Presenter:* **Dave Andrascik, DRE, PA DRE State Coordinator, PA DUI Association:** All attendees will conduct an instructor supervised training evaluation. Subjects of evaluations will role play, and DREs will be required to reach the appropriate opinion of impairment. These evaluations are required for recertification and all participants will be engaged. *DRE Track*

Take a Breath and Reconstruct – the Art and Science of DRE Reconstruction. *Presenter: Chuck Matson, South Dakota DRE, SD LET Adjunct Instructor & Former IACP DRE Section Chair:* This workshop will focus on the scene of a fatality, or series injury, crash. The goal of this training will assist DREs to better able to reconstruct the role of psychoactive drugs. *DRE Track*

DUI Cannabis - Understanding the Highway High- *Presenter:* Chuck Matson, South Dakota DRE, SD LET Adjunct Instructor & Former IACP DRE Section Chair: This session will focus on indicators that too frequently overlooked in cannabis impairment. Participants can expect to gain knowledge in indicators of cannabis impairment. *DRE Track*

Specialized Driving Assessment: Differentiating between Impairment and Special Needs Drivers – *Presenters:* Cori Doughty, Supervisor & DUI County Coordinator Lehigh County Adult Probation & Leo Hegarty, DRE, Regional DUI Program Administrator, PA DUI Association: There are no laws against driving with an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), but safety is key. Driving can be stressful and challenging in many ways. ASD drivers, depending on the severity of their diagnosis, might struggle more to adapt to the rapidly changing environment that comes with driving. ASD diagnosed drivers may, when placed in stressful situations, exhibit behavioral signs and indicators that many officers typically associate with alcohol or drug impairment. This presentation will provide details of ASD, how and why some ASD diagnosed people are able to drive, and what officers may see when interacting with an ASD diagnosed driver. *Law Enforcement, DRE & Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track*

Impaired Driving Case Law - *Presenter:* Ande Gonzalez, DRE, Lancaster County, Assistant District Attorney: This workshop is designed to present, interpret, and discuss institutional issues related to traffic, and drug and alcohol-related enforcement activities. Issues to be discussed include: DUI case law; implied consent, standardized field sobriety testing, Miranda issues, police liability and current decisions relating to office safety issues. *Law Enforcement, DRE & Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track*

Driver Licensing Challenges - *Presenter:* **Cori Doughty, Supervisor & DUI County Coordinator Lehigh County Adult Probation:** This workshop will focus on court and legislative matters affecting driver's license suspension for DUI offenders as well as matters regarding ignition interlock. Participants will have ample opportunity to ask questions. *Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track*

Decriminalization of Drugs with a Focus on Marijuana - *Presenter:* **Scott Davis, DRE, Regional DUI Program Administrator, PA DUI Association:** This workshop will focus on the data and outcome of legalizing the cannabis industry in states such as Colorado, Washington and California. Issues to be discussed will also include current trends in legalizing the Eastern seaboard. *Law Enforcement Track & DRE Track*

Alcohol Impairment vs. Cannabis Impairment - *Presenter*: Chuck Matson, South Dakota DRE, SD LET Adjunct Instructor & Former IACP DRE Section Chair: This workshop will focus on the clear, but often missed, signs of impairment for alcohol and cannabis. Training features will include indicators of the two types of impairment. *Law Enforcement Track*

Take a Breath and Reconstruct-Focus on Inhalants - Presenter: Chuck Matson, South Dakota DRE, SD LET Adjunct Instructor & Former IACP DRE Section Chair. This workshop will focus on the scene of a fatality, or serious injury crash. The goal of this training is to assist officers to better able to reconstruct the role of inhalant drugs. Law Enforcement Track

Best Practices in Alcohol Highway Safety Programs - Moderators: Chris Shanley, Deputy Director, Allegheny County Pre-Trial Services & Cori Doughty, Supervisor & DUI County Coordinator Lehigh County Adult Probation & C. Stephen Erni, Executive Director, PA DUI Association & Wendy Whitehaus Cole, Assistant Executive Director, PA DUI Association. The pandemic has caused changes in delivery of the Alcohol Highway Safety Program, this session will address those changes and discuss best practices moving forward. Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track

Drugged Driving Legally for the Alcohol Highway Safety Professional- Presenters: Chris Shanley, Deputy Director, Allegheny County Pre-Trial Services & Craig Amos, DRE, Regional DUI Program Administrator, PA DUI Association: This updated course is designed to address the challenges presented to alcohol highway safety professionals regarding polysubstance use of impaired drivers. Drug impaired driving is becoming more and more prevalent on Pennsylvania's highways and illicit drugs only comprise part of the problem; prescription drugs and medical marijuana contribute greatly to the issue. Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track

Clients in Crisis & De-Escalation - *Presenter:* Dr. Ruth Moore, Director, Business Development & Admissions Pennsylvania Psychiatric Institute - Learn assessment and de-escalation techniques for patients *experiencing a* crisis *or* mental health emergency. *Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track*

Suicide, Violence, Mental Illness, & Addiction- *Presenter:* Ken Montrose, Greenbriar, Training & Publications Director: This training alerts professionals to the connection between violence, suicide, mental illness, and/or addiction. The cycles of violence and suicide attempts will be discussed with an eye on how to intervene at each stage. *Alcohol Highway Safety Program Track*

Each DRE enrolled in this class must submit the following items to Regional Coordinator Ande Gonzalez (agonzalez@padui.org) no later than September 30, 2021:

- 1. Up to date CV
- 2. Rolling Log for 2020 and 2021
- 3. Drug Influence Evaluation (Preferably involving a refusal to submit to chemical testing)

During the courtroom simulations, each DRE will be subjected to both direct and cross-examination by experienced DUI attorneys and critiqued by a former judge.

Registration for DREs is limited, Prosecutors are invited to observe.

*DREs are expected to be fully prepared for court, including court appropriate attire. Reserve your spot by checking the Training on the conference registration form & submitting all required materials to Mr. Gonzalez.
