Out-of-School Time in Georgia

Out-of-school time (OST) includes afterschool, summer learning, and weekend youth development programs.

21st CCLC

GaDOE administers the 21st CCLC program via \$41 million in federal funding.

Out of School Services

DFCS provides \$15.5 million via TANF to serve low-to-moderate income communities & youth in foster care.

BOOST

GaDOE supports access to afterschool and summer learning programs via \$12.5 million in state funding.

Afterschool Combats Chronic Absenteeism


- 68% of students with a school day attendance rate at or below 90% in the prior school year improved their attendance rate in the current school year while participating in Georgia's 21st CCLC program.
- Afterschool programs can work with parents, offer youth incentives,
 and partner with school districts to improve attendance.

Summer Learning Combats Chronic Absenteeism

- Youth regularly participating in high quality afterschool and summer
 learning programs experience improved academic outcomes,
 behavior, and attendance rates. Programs can use this tool to improve student attendance. (Attendance Works: Expanded Learning Providers)
- Summer programs help students avoid the summer slide and increase achievement in reading and math, improve school engagement, and
- reduce risky behaviors. (How States Are Expanding Quality Summer Learning Opportunities)

The Challenge

Today, 1 in 4 four students are chronically absent in America.



EVIDENCE FROM BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS

- Clubs boost school attendance & effort
- > More days in afterschool = stronger results
- > 2024 longitudinal study:
 - 61% of ages 9–12 didn't skip school
 - 70% of teens didn't skip school
- > Only 7% of Club youth chronically absent vs. 11% statewide (CT DOE Study)
- > Frequent attendees (2+ times/week) = 2x less likely o be chronically absent

Attendance & Engagement





The Club Difference

Boys & Girls Clubs help more students stay on track and graduate with a plan for the future.



Year-Round Learning

- Afterschool programs in STEM, art, literacy & more
- Club kids more likely to retain math/reading skills over summer
- Higher rates of A's & B's when returning to school

College & Career Readiness

- Support with applications, financial aid, career exploration
- 2 in 3 Club seniors explore careers vs. 1 in 4 peers nationally

Graduation & Beyond

- 97% of Club teens expect to graduate high school (vs. 87% nationally)
- Over half plan to pursue a bachelor's or higher
- Helps boost adult population with advanced degrees (currently 14%)

Research Evidence



The Out of School Time Difference



Out of School Time Impact

- Meta-Analysis (128 Studies, K–12): 41% showed improved attendance & enrollment
- Chicago After School Matters program: Participants missed 7.5 days vs. peers' 9.6 days
- Horizons Study: Summer Learning (6,000 youth, 19 states):
 - 4+ summers = higher attendance & less chronic absenteeism
 - Elementary/Middle: +1.1 pts (≈2 extra days)
 - ⊢ High School: +3.6 pts (≈6.5 extra days)


Georgia YMCAs: School Partnership and Support Services

- We offer on-site programs and transportation support.
- Data-sharing agreements and family engagement events.

OST Coalition:

Recommendations for Legislative Support

- BOOST 2.0: Build on the state's annual investment in community-based out-of-school time programs to \$20M.
- Expand funding for school-based health and social services.
- Support transportation and attendance incentive programs.
- Increase access to mental health services.
- School districts agree to share attendance data.
