YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY INTERN

SUMMER POSITION OPENING

Lebanon Presbyterian church is seeking applicants for a Summer Intern to minister to Lebanon area college aged young adults during the summer. The Young Adult Ministry Intern will be responsible for the pastoral care of college students and their friends and facilitating regular ministry gatherings. Possible summer “home stay” housing is available.

Duties:

Peer-mentoring and pastoral care role as they meet regularly with other young adults. The intern will lead at least one weekly Bible study for college students through the duration of the summer. Plan, promote, organize & lead fellowship events to build relationships and develop community. Plan, promote, organize & lead a summer retreat or mission trip for college/young adults. Participate in leading Sunday morning worship, with the possibility of preaching once during the summer. This is designed to be a full time position and the intern is expected to keep standard office hours and attend weekly staff meetings. Peer-mentoring and pastoral care role as they meet regularly with other young adults. Meet weekly with Associate Pastor and Student Ministry Director for oversight and ideas. Monthly meeting and regular correspondence with the Young Adult Ministry Team. Reports to the Ministry Pastor with guidance from the Student Ministry Director. Required communication with college-age young adults will begin before the effective start date.

This position will extend (12 weeks) from May 2022 until August 2022. Full-Time Exempt.

Qualifications:

Have a clear testimony of faith in Jesus Christ and a call to this ministry position.

Be a mature, evangelical Christian with a strong biblical foundation.

Have a high school Diploma and have or be seeking a college degree.

Ability to handle personal information in a confidential manner.

Commitment to the long-term development of Young Adult Ministry at LPC.

Positive example in personal relationships, family life and moral and ethical character.

Have training and/or experience in Relational Ministry and display a love for Ministry.

Willingness to be trained to grow in skills.

Able to provide professional, character, and spiritual references upon request.

Access to a car is optimal for this internship as public transportation is limited.

Drivers license Required.

Personal Faith:

Demonstrate and maintain a personal saving relationship with Jesus Christ, Spirit-filled life, Biblical Knowledge, Christian Worldview, and an Evangelistic Attitude. Have a respect for reformed traditions and ability to affirm EPC Essentials of Our Faith & LPC Sexuality Statement (lebanonpresbyterian.org/beliefs/) Demonstrate and model personal spiritual discipline including but not limited to personal Bible study and devotion, an active prayer life, and participation in the worship and fellowship of Lebanon Presbyterian Church.

Definitions:

Cover Letter: A written document submitted with a job application outlining the applicant's credentials and interest in the open position.

Résumé: A résumé or resume is a document created and used by a person to present their background, skills, and accomplishments. Résumés can be used for a variety of reasons, but most often they are used to secure new employment. A typical résumé contains a "summary" of relevant job experience and education.

Testimony: A narrative account of your faith history and conversion or acceptance of Jesus as your Lord and Savior.

Statement of Faith: A personal faith statement reflects an individual's thoughts about his/her relationship with God, church and Jesus Christ. It is important to cite scripture to justify your perspective. It may be helpful to use phrases beginning with "I believe," and to include anecdotal accounts to describe your faith journey.

Ministry Vision:

A brief overview of how you see yourself in this role: Your heart, ideas and plans for this ministry and vision for what God might be calling you to do in this ministry. The applicant is encouraged to ask questions, research and dream about what could happen this summer in ministry.
