

RAPS Foundation in Regulatory Affairs (FRA Credential) free offer - deadline 20 Feb 2025

Dear Regulatory Affairs Professional,

RAPS has been developing a new credential for regulatory professionals with 0-3 years' experience who want to demonstrate their regulatory knowledge before they are eligible for the RAC or RCC. This new credential will be the Foundation in Regulatory Affairs (FRA). Before we can launch this credential to the public, we need a few more test takers to ensure the scoring process is valid and reliable. The ideal candidate is an individual who is newer to regulatory or transitioning into regulatory from another adjacent industry with 0-3 years of regulatory experience.

The exam is only 40 questions and is available online. The exam will be offered for FREE until all seats are filled. Registration closes on 20 February. The exam must be completed by 25 February. I have included more detailed information below and will be happy to answer any questions.

What is the FRA and why is RAPS creating it?

Regulatory leaders have expressed the need for a credential for early-career professionals who do not qualify for the RAC or RCC yet. The FRA demonstrates that a current or potential employee has gained important foundational knowledge that can give an employer confidence.

By participating in this pilot program, you will help ensure that the regulatory field has a pipeline of competent, qualified professionals for the future.

Exam Registration and Scheduling

All exams have 40 questions and will be taken online through RAPS Learning Portal. To reiterate, registration will close on 20 February and the exam must be completed by 25 February. There will be no extensions.

After you register, your exam will be available on the RAPS Learning Portal. You choose the day and time to take your exam between now – 25 February. After you begin your exam, you will need to complete it in one sitting. There is no time limit, but we estimate it will take an hour to complete.
