


Did you know?

We have a Personal Development Section? I was re-entering this section last week and found some interesting books for your summer reading.




Say Yes to No

Greg is one of the Presbytery authors we have been telling you about. He states using the power of NO is to create the best in life, work and love.




Scarred by Struggle, Transformed

The authors have combined their unwavering faith in God with their social media skills to create this book. They prove that faith and technology can work together for the greater good. What a concept!




The Good Neighbor: Life and
