Hear Ye, Hear Ye- Race Announcement

Your entry and dues payment makes you a member of the fleet in good standing for 2018

1. The race order is divided up into heats depending on the amount of entries
2. Our goal is to have each sailor race in at least 2 races
3. Lane positioning at the start line will be done by personal preference and free will, and how wet you want to get. (your height may also be a limiting factor if there is a drop off)
4. The top 3 in each heat will advance to the next round
5. Points will be tallied & your total finishes will determine your status in the Championship “Open” Final
6. There are no throw outs
7. Once you let go of your boat, **note, let go**, not push, there is **no more contact** with your boat or anyone else’s boat...in other words, you can get out of the water & head to the finish line to help identify your boat to the scorers.
8. Contact rule: there isn’t any
9. The chase boat will round up wayward boats and bring them back to the beach
10. Race Course: A reach, start to finish
11. Do not leave your cell phone in your pocket, a la Jeff Merrill
12. Lining up for the start: wait for the **whistle** before starting
13. DO NOT PUSH YOUR BOAT, FOLLOW YOUR BOAT LIKE A PUPPY, OR INTERFER WITH THE WIND OF ANOTHER CONTESTANT.
14. Remember the PRO can change rules and make decisions as the racing progresses....due to factors out his control, i.e. wind and tide.

Words of wisdom from our all-time fearless leader and lifetime PRO, Jeff Merrill:
