# abyc fishing<sub>ip</sub>

he second ABYC Fishing Team event is in the books, and what an event it was. Twenty-one members and guests enjoyed on over-night trip aboard the 65' sport fishing vessel Prowler out of Fisherman's Landing in San Diego. Fishing in the San Diego area had been very good up to the week of the trip but fish counts had dropped which brought a level of uncertainty about what to expect.

Leaving at 9pm Friday September 22nd, the team was met by fairly heavy seas once past the protection of Point Loma. Seems everyone was taken by surprise by the excessive rolling of the boat. Some more than others if you get my drift. Get the patch folks!

After motoring slowly through the night, the morning brought calmer seas and a beautiful sunrise over the Rosarito Baja coast where we begin to troll. It wasn't long before the first fish came over the rail followed by about a 10 minute yellowfin tuna bite that

had just about everybody with a fish. Great start with 18 10-15lb yellowfin tuna on board. Also known as ahi tuna, the yellowfin is about as good as it gets for sushi and sashimi. While a little on the small side of the tuna scale, the fight these fish put up is amazing which made for some fun and exciting battles for the veteran and beginner fisherman alike.



After the brief

but productive first stop, the next few hours of trolling while looking for kelp paddies, feeding birds, or any sign of life were fruitless. Although we had a boat full of friends and family to pass the time, there seemed to be a level of waning anticipation while waiting for the next bite as the time to head back was approaching. Typically there isn't more than an hour between bites when fish are in the area.

However, the old adage "be careful what you wish for", was about to become reality- With about an hour before the fishing was over, we came into a huge school of yellowfin. Mayhem, pandemonium, chaos, whatever you want to call it, it was happening and happening fast. All 21 of us were "hooked up" for the better part of 45 minutes with a non-stop tuna bite.


t's that time of year for the annual purging of the ABYC Lost & Found. Please check it for any of your lost items by November 1st. After that all items will be washed and donated or trashed.

# racing<sub>ules</sub> #34

t position 1, Yellow and Blue are on starboard tack approaching the race committee boat to start. Blue is clear astern, but faster than yellow. Yellow starts to luff at position 2 to close the gap between her and the race committee boat.

Between position 2 and 3, Blue establishes a windward overlap. At position 3 the start signal was made. Yellow hails "no room" and Blue hails Yellow to sail her proper course. Yellow continues to luff to head to wind at position 4. Blue responds to Yellows luff and keeps clear. There is space for Blue to pass between Yellow and the race committee boat.

Blue hails protest and displays a flag, protesting Yellow for sailing above her proper course after the starting signal.

Sailing took place inside Los Angeles Harbor in the upper middle break wall area near Angels Gate under 7 – 10 knot conditions on the first two days with the final and third day offering up an ideal 12- 14 knot sea breeze. Gold fleet included a seven race series (2 races on Friday, 3 on Saturday, and 2 on Sunday) with no throwouts. Our ABYC Cal 20's were either towed by power boat or sailed up on Thursday It was great fun to enjoy the hospitality of CBYC with their second floor bar/dining hall overlooking the marina. Social events included complimentary Ballast Point



keggers, a Friday evening burger bash, and a Saturday dinner followed by the annual Class meeting and surf tunes from the Rip Tide. After sailing on Sunday, we all enjoyed a wonderful 14 knot downwind sail and made the 30 minute drive back up to CBYC for the trophies.



A down to the wire finish in the final race of the Cal 20 Class Championships determined the winner of the class's 56<sup>th</sup> championship. 



onclusions and Rules that Apply
Rule 11, On the Same Tack, Overlapped Rule 17, On the Same
Tack; Proper Course Rule 18, Mark-Room

Rule 18 does not apply at a starting mark surrounded by navigable water. Yellow can luff head to wind after the starting signal, as she has no rule 17 proper course restriction because Blue was clear astern and became overlapped to windward of Yellow on the same tack. Blue, as windward boat, is required to keep clear by Rule 11.






