Class of 2021:

The Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) began Bright Futures Scholarship evaluations of 2020-2021 high school seniors this month. Eligibility determination is posted to the Financial Aid Recipient History (FARH) on your student account. Further instructions on how to access eligibility determination can be found on the next page. In order for a student to qualify for Bright Futures, all five requirements must be met:

- Submit a complete Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31, 2021;
- Complete the required 16 specific courses by high school graduation;
- Achieve the required grade point average in the required coursework;
- Complete the required number of service hours by high school graduation; and
- Achieve the required college entrance exam (ACT/SAT) score no later than June 30, 2021.
