## RABBINIC REFLECTIONS

**Rabbi Rachel Salston**



Shalom u'vrakah aleihhem. May peace and blessing be upon all of you. Along with all of you, and the Marcus family, I am grieving the loss of my president and friend, Evan L. Marcus. Evan and I worked so closely together and I am in shock from his death. Evan and I had spoken

almost every day for two years and now we will not meet again in this life. No matter how many times I sit with a family in mourning, nothing can, nor for that matter, should be able to, prepare you for the loss of a friend. I offer my deepest condolences to his wife Carol, children Hannah, Jonathan, and Wendee, his sister Abby, and his entire extended family.

Evan Marcus loved this community and he loved community in general. Just a week and a half after his death, as our member Larry Bach sat shiva for his mother (we offer our condolences to the Bach family, the Chedzemova family, the Wilk/Fishler family, and all others who have buried loved ones in this challenging month of January), he quoted Evan, "You never know why you need a community until you need a community." This could be a Yogi Berraism (my apologies to Evan for comparing him to a New York Yankee); we can all understand what he meant. A Jewish community, a synagogue is the institution that you join, invest in, participate in, pray with, eat with, sing with, cry with, and dance with. Sometimes you don't know what the point is, until the day that you need your community.

Our community is so excellent at stepping up when there is a death or illness, in particular. I said to a few people in the past week that mourning is the time that all of the behind the scenes work that it takes to run a synagogue and serve a community pastorally comes out into the public: logistics, presence, love. It is when the constant in all of our lives, our Fair Lawn Jewish Center/Congregation B'nai Israel family steps up for us. I personally would like to thank everyone who sent me a Shabbat meal when I was incapacitated with RSV a few weeks ago and sent me well wishes then and now (I am writing this on January 24th, home sick with COVID). I am so grateful for your hesed.

I think we've all had a moment in the past month when we've realized how much we need this community. How much we need each other. So, this month of February/Shevat-Adar, find a way to give back to us, or more accurately, pay the hesed forward. If we have another family sitting shiva (God forbid), come out and help make a minyan. Call a

friend when they are sick. Come set up kiddush. Come to an adult education program. Come celebrate at the two B'nai Mitzvah services and Auf Ruf we have scheduled for this month. Share in the joy!

A few years ago, I had a memorable exchange with a funeral director from one of our local funeral homes. We joked that we would like to see each other not at the cemetery some time. What is the opposite of a funeral? I realized that it is celebrating the holiday of opposites.

While we agreed that it might be a bit odd and morbid for a funeral home to cosponsor the FLJC/CBI Purim Carnival, the meaning was clear. We have to celebrate as a community when we have occasion to celebrate. We are a community that comes together for death, of course, but Judaism is a religion of life. The synagogue, your community is here for when you know you need us, but we're also here for the times you might not think you need us.

Yes, mandated joy can feel strange. That's actually built into the complexity of Purim, which is a classic story: we were at the brink of destruction, we were saved at the final moment, and we now celebrate the relief of a miracle. It's terrifying if you think about it too much. But, we take a day out of the year when we let loose and have fun together. That's the holiday for that (Erev Purim is Monday, March 6th, please join us for the Megillah reading and a gathering). We all need more joy in our lives; we all need joy together with our shul.

In addition to Purim, B'nai Mitzvah, and an Auf Ruf, we have a lot of fun activities planned for the next few weeks and months. We're planning an adults night out axe throwing party (yes, you read that right, we will all stay safe) sometime in March. We have lively Shabbat services every Friday night and Saturday morning. The more friends who join us, the more ruah (spirit) fills the room.

I look forward to being with you in joy and I steadfastly promise to be with you in sadness. May Evan's memory be for a blessing.

Shevat is most famous for the holiday of *Tu B'Shevat* celebrated on the 15th of the month (Feb 6). *Tu B'Shevat* is the "Rosh Hashana of the trees". After the rains, the ground is wet and ready for the planting season. I find it intriguing that our calendar wraps up the year with a planting phase. ## A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear fellow congregants,

I did not expect to be writing this column so soon this year. Like all of us, I was shocked when I received the call from Carol Marcus on Wednesday morning, January 11, that Evan z"l had died. I prepared the following statement that I read during Shabbat on January 14, "I would like to share some thoughts that have consumed my mind since receiving the call from Carol. My breath was taken away in disbelief. I want to say to Carol, Hannah, Wendee and Jonathan and the entire extended Marcus family how incredibly sorrowful I feel and what a profound loss this is, not only to us all individually, whom he touched and who were fortunate enough to have known Evan, but also to the FLJC/CBI and the entire Jewish Community in Fair Lawn and beyond.

"Evan and I were both in the same technology industry and therefore immediately made a connection and could speak the same language. We were both computer geeks and talked about the latest gadgets, about playing wordle or about applying technology within the center and at home. This presented itself in ways that may not be known to all specifically but are in use every day. The MPC telephone directory was his baby, our current website, the (fljc.com) email domain maintenance and the push behind starting zoom and Livestreaming all started with a spark from Evan. He was our unofficial photographer at all events and was proud of his huge collection of movies that he tapped for our recent Hannukah movie night. But more than that he had a passion and interest in serving and helping people in any and every way possible. I know that he loved his family and spoke about them often, so they became our center family as well. As it's already been said, He made connections. He always wanted to reach out to our members and try to be as inclusive as possible in all our programming. He made an immediate connection with our Rabbi Salston and worked in every way to help serve as a guide to her relationship with our membership. He also made connections with our neighbors in the community, the other shuls nearby, but in particular making connections with the other Conservative synagogues. He understood that this would be an imperative for the long-term survival of Conservative Judaism in Bergen County. He was particularly involved in the establishment of our joint Hebrew school with the JCC of Paramus, The Community Hebrew School of Bergen County. He was so excited for each and every B'nai Mitzvah that was held and how joyful it was to have families back in the shul.

"As President he was a consensus style leader. He

rarely wanted to make decisions by edict even if that meant hosting heated discussions with differing opinions. That was okay as long as in the end we had a majority consensus on the way forward. Evan and I had plans. We talked often but never often enough. Plans to meet and discuss the transition from his presidency to mine, plans to review the next important steps in reviving committee participation, plans for the upcoming Purim Carnival, plans for his Gala, plans for community outreach, plans in assuring our long-term survival and most importantly plans to talk about the health and well-being of ourselves and our families.

"Just as mentioned by Evan's son, Jonathan, previously, it is said in a Yiddish proverb, Man plans and God laughs. Oh, how sad when such a proverb is played out before us. Let me conclude by humbly borrowing one last time from Evan's weekly announcements: *What I learned this week is that no matter how crisis presents itself, we are a community that comes together and assures the support, comfort, security, and consideration of its members.*

"May Evan's memory be forever a blessing to us all."

The FLJC/CBI Constitution and By-Laws specifies that the Executive Vice President must step in to fill the vacancy of the President in order that the functioning of the Synagogue continues without interruption. At the Board meeting on Wednesday, January 25, I was installed as the new President of the FLJC/CBI. I accept this responsibility with humility and honor and hope to live up to the duties and expectations of our community. I had hoped that Evan would be here to guide me and share his wisdom and experience from the past two years, but I know his spirit is still among us and I look forward to serving with the same commitment as he did.

I will be reaching out to many of you for your help and support and I wish all of us the strength and courage and commitment to the long-term survival of Conservative Egalitarian Judaism in Bergen County as practiced at our center.

## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Last month I wrote about the generosity of our members and mentioned some of the funds that they have established to support particular activities or causes. While I had planned to highlight another of our funds in this edition of the *News & Views*, the death of Evan

Marcus has caused me to change my plans. Instead, I want to share some of my thoughts about Evan and his generous commitment of time to the Synagogue.

I probably knew Evan for a far shorter time than anyone else in the congregation, only having met him when I joined the staff at the end of June. And yet, for the last six months, I worked very closely with him, talking or corresponding with him on an almost daily basis. Our relationship was professional, but Evan shared a warmth with me that I could imagine would blossom into a friendship, after his tenure as President had ended.

One of the things that struck me about Evan from very early on was his dedication and commitment to the Synagogue. I suppose that could be said of every President of a synagogue, as one does not rise to that position without showing a commitment to the organization, but it was certainly true for Evan. While he had a full-time day job and a family to occupy his time, the Synagogue seemed always to be on his mind. My phone is a testament to this, as he shared his concerns and ideas through a regular stream of emails, phone calls and texts, and responded to my notes as if they were the most important things on his agenda. I cannot recall a time when I sent him a request for guidance or comment that he did not reply immediately. I sometimes felt bad about intruding on his personal time, but he never hinted that it was any imposition.

His interactions with me, however, were just the tip of the iceberg. Far more demanding of his time were meetings and conversations with members of the

congregation. In addition to preparing and helping to run the monthly Board and Executive Committee meetings, he held weekly meetings with the Rabbi, Steven Montag and me; and worked in meetings or phone calls with other committee chairs and congregants on a regular basis. I doubt if there were any days when he did not have at least one discussion about the Synagogue with someone.

I think, and hope, that he took some pride in his work as president. I know that he was pleased to have his name on the president's office door, despite the fact that he rarely used it. And pleased to have a mailbox that said "president". But much more than any of these minor trappings of the office, the one thing that I know brought him pleasure was inspiring others to commit their time – to see others stepping in to help the Synagogue.

And here, although he was always calling for more volunteers, I hope he saw what I see: an active membership that is reemerging from the Covid years and reviving the spirit of the congregation. I see dozens of members who regularly serve on committees, plan programs, organize events, and work to sustain the vibrancy of the FLJC/CBI. The fact is that Evan was not alone in giving generously of his time and energy. Yes, he led by example, but he had many others working with him from across the community. Indeed, the Synagogue could not survive without all the work done by volunteers.

I will miss working with Evan. I will also miss the chance to get to know him as a past-president. But I already am grateful for all that he did for the FLJC/CBI and look forward to working with other congregants who step into his shoes. Let me close with a thanks to Evan and all our volunteers for their generous commitment of time.

## SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE

The Social Action Committee thanks you for your very generous donations in helping us with our Emergency Supply Packages collection. With your help we purchased kosher packaged goods and packed more than 100 winter emergency supply packages for Meals on Wheels recipients as well as others supported by Jewish Family Services in our community.

Social Action worked with our religious school students to pack these bags. We thank Ilene Laufer for all her work and for organizing this project. See enclosed photos of this project.

Social Action has begun to work with the Northern New Jersey Sanctuary Coalition which serves as support for people who have applied for political or cultural asylum and been released from federal detention, and other asylum seekers.

Among the services the Coalition provides are housing; access to medical care; financial support; educational opportunities including language instruction; transportation; social events; liaison with attorneys; and, help with job searches and dealing with bureaucratic offices. Occasionally, we may reach out to our congregation to see if anyone can donate needed items such as a good couch or bed, etc. These refugees are going through the legal process of seeking asylum or applying for legal status through some other government program.

Helping refugees is a basic teaching of the Torah, *"When a stranger resides with you in your land, you shall not wrong him. The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens; you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the Land of Egypt. I am the Lord your God."* (Leviticus 19:33-34). Watch for future communications regarding this project.

Our Pre-Passover Food Drive is coming up in mid-March to provide donated food to local food banks and monetary donations. Flyers with details will be sent out in a few weeks.

The Social Action Committee can also help congregants in their recovery from illness when returning from the hospital or rehab facility by bringing them a Friday night meal. Please let the office at [info@fljc.com](mailto:info@fljc.com) or 201-796-5040.
