Founded in 1973, the Korean Community Services of Metropolitan New York, Inc. (KCS) is a non-profit organization that assists Korean and Asian immigrants in becoming independent and thriving members of the community by overcoming linguistic, economic, and health barriers. KCS's programs focus on aging, education, immigration, workforce development, mental health, and public health and research.

With six locations in the New York City area, including four in Queens, KCS serves more than 1,300 individuals daily with the help of ten board members, 29 full-time staff, 49 part-time staff, and approximately 120 volunteers.
