#### PRENTICE INSTITUTE RECEIVES CFLSA GRANT

The Prentice Institute for Global Population and Economy has received a \$15,000 grant from the Community Foundation of Lethbridge and Southwestern Alberta to support rural community-based education in Southern Alberta for the next 12 months. This grant will significantly remove financial barriers for both municipal and not-for profit leaders in the region, and help them to access rurally-focused professional development



courses. More importantly, it is intended to support not just rural development and leadership, but also to build closer relationships between the University of Lethbridge, the Institute, and both rural and Indigenous communities in Southern Alberta.

Designed to support a new partnership between the Prentice Institute, the University of Alberta and the University of Lethbridge, this grant will facilitate access to courses from both the Augustana Faculties "Augustana Extended Education" (AEE) Program and the new Faculty of Arts and Sciences' Continuing Education and Professional Development initiative. The broader goal behind these courses and programs is to support rural community capacity and leadership by delivering courses that respond to expressed rural needs and priorities. Courses are taught by a combination of senior faculty from different universities, as well as established practitioners in areas such as law, politics, community development and planning. Prior to COVID-19, courses were delivered in person in rural communities around the province.

Established through a bequest for Bill Long and named for his uncle Henry S. Varley, the objective of the Henry S. Varley Fund for Rural Life is to enhance and sustain a quality of life in the rural communities of southwestern Alberta.

"Preparing for the future: Using an Equity Lens to inform a New Generation of Evidence Building on environments and Health"

**Abstract:** The challenges to futurity presented within the Anthropocene are significant. As human and earth systems interact to produce increasingly challenging threats to the future of the human family and the environments upon which we are inextricably dependent, a new era of integrated and equity informed responses are required. This talk presents an overview of a new generation of equity informed research on environments and health in Canada and offers examples of the power of planning for the future when evidence is asset-based, grounded in place and informed by the principles of intergenerational justice.

### FUNDING OPPORTUNITY: THE PRENTICE INSTITUTE KNOWLEDGE SYNTHESIS GRANTS (PIKSG)

### Prentice Institute Knowledge Synthesis Grants (PIKSG)

The Prentice Institute for Global Population and Economy seeks applications to support knowledge synthesis projects and associated deliverables that will aid in the identification of knowledge gaps and to support the use of evidence in decision making. This funding stream will support a small number of very targeted projects using knowledge synthesis methodologies (meta-analyses, systematic reviews, scoping reviews, etc.) to (a) assess the current state of knowledge; (b) identify gaps, bias or opportunities; (c) identify key or consistent results, methods or practices; and (d) inform new research activities. The grants are limited to the synthesis of subjects that are directly aligned with the research priorities of the Institute, and may be considered a pathway to future applications to comparable programs (eg. the SSHRC KSG funding stream). Primary research (including data collection) and/or travel (other than a modest amount (15%) for knowledge mobilization) will NOT be supported from this fund.

**Eligibility:** Research Affiliates of the Prentice Institute with an academic appointment at the University of Lethbridge are eligible to apply as project leads. Additional members of the research team are not required to be Prentice Affiliates

Term: PIKSG projects are usually anticipated to be 12 months in length.

The Prentice Institute Affiliate Partnership Grant (PIAPG) The Prentice Institute for Global Population and Economy provides funding to assist Affiliates in independent research that directly supports the Mission and Mandate of the Institute. This Partnership Grant has been made available to support Research Affiliates in fostering inter-institutional development of projects and applications. The intellectual leadership for the partnership can originate from the research community and/or from partner organizations (public, private, and not-for-profit); however, only a Research Affiliate of the Prentice Institute can submit the proposal and administer the funding within the partnership. The proposal must include a formalized partnership(s) and evidence of collaboration or collaborative potential. # LARS HALLSTROM, DIRECTOR, KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Rural Youth: Pathways to Mental Health and Well-being

Lars Hallstrom, PhD.

Director, Prentice Institute, Professor of Political Science, University of Lethbridge



Dr. Hallstrom spoke in April at the Alberta School Councils Conference AGM. His

presentation examined the functional challenges of youth mental health and draws from the results of projects conducted by the Alberta Centre for Sustainable Rural Communities to better understand the causal pathways to mental health, the prevalence of mental health issues in rural youth, and the opportunities or skills needed for developing and maintaining mental health resilience. He also explored the wealth of interventions available, with a particular emphasis upon school and art-based programming, literacy initiatives, lifestyle changes and strategies for youth as they transition to adulthood.
