Watching this introductory video with your scholar can be a helpful way to understand what is required of them during this remote learning time. There will be a small review quiz at the end of the week, and the scholars will be able to reference their notes.

## Student Remote Expectations

1. Be present, stay focused, and sit in scholarly position with your camera on.
2. Wear your uniform top Mon.-Thurs. and either your uniform top or a spirit shirt on Fri. (expected, not enforced)
3. Use a workspace that is conducive to paying attention and completing schoolwork. Ideally, this will be a space with minimal distractions.
4. Reduce camera distractions (avoid people moving in the background, TV/music, toys, animals, etc.).
5. Adjust your screen or camera to best show your face.

- Your screen or camera should be level with your face.
- If possible, keep windows in front of you, never behind you.

6. Change the display name to the student's name in Zoom while you are in the waiting room so your teacher can let you into the meeting. If your name is not correct, then you will not be admitted into the meeting room.
7. Be mindful not to disrupt the learning environment. Classes will be recorded. If a student continues to be disruptive after reminders regarding their behavior, the teacher may move the student into the waiting room for a specified period until they may rejoin the class.
