Subject Overviews Language Arts: This week we will return to grammar by

<u>Language Arts:</u> This week we will return to grammar by reviewing what we have learned so far (types of sentences, principle elements, adverbs, and adjectives). There will not be a new spelling list since it is a short week. Scholars will continue memorizing Robert Frost's "The Road Not Taken". We will be reading *Black Ships Before Troy* by Rosemary Sutcliff.

Math: We will continue our work with fractions of measurements and begin to look at fractions of an amount (how to create the proper fraction). We will review a bit throughout the week and will have a test the following Monday.

<u>History:</u> We pick back up with our study of the Renaissance by looking at the contributions of Lorenzo de'Medici and the artist, Botticelli, again focusing on the link between artists and patrons.

<u>Science</u>: Continuing our study of space, we are going to look at galaxies in their various forms and look more closely at our own galaxy, the Milky Way.
