

A Note about Holy Communion at Amazing Grace

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday and all are welcome to partake in the sacrament at the Lord's Table. Parents can determine if they wish their children to receive Holy Communion or a blessing. When you come to the altar you may stand or kneel.

The presiding minister places the bread/wafer in our hand (gluten-free wafers are available). The Worship Assistant will offer a tray of pre-filled wine and grape juice, with the grape juice in the 7 center cups. Another altar server will collect your empty cup, and you may return to your seat. If you wish to receive a blessing only, simply cross your arms as you come to the altar.

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9-18

⁹At [Horeb, the mount of God,][Elijah] came to a cave, and spent the night there.

Then the word of the LORD came to him, saying, “What are you doing here, Elijah?” ¹⁰He answered, “I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.”

When evening came, he was there alone,²⁴but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them.²⁵And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea.²⁶But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear.²⁷But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

²⁸Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."²⁹He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus.³⁰But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!"³¹Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?"³²When they got into the boat, the wind ceased.³³And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."


