With the kick-off to the new year, 2020 is a great time to consider applying for Plan NH's Municipal Technical Assistance Grant (MTAG) program. Accepted on a rolling basis, the applications for this program can be found on the [PlanNH website](#).

Funding supports municipal expansion of options for places to live (e.g., by location, and/or design and/or price-point) through changes in zoning regulations. The money can be used to hire consultants to review current regulations and re-write zoning or to create new ordinances to address the wants and needs of the community's members regarding housing choices.

Plan NH is more than happy to meet with communities to provide more details about the program and the outcomes of others who have been awarded funds. In the SRPC region, Dover, Rochester, and Farmington have all been MTAG recipients.

Each Legislative Bulletin contains a brief analysis of key legislative developments during the past week, a legislative calendar listing municipal bills to be heard in the next two weeks, a call to action on scheduled hearings, and updates on federal issues of interest to municipalities."
