

SPS Interim and Three-Year Goal Update

<p>75% of hospitals completing Safety Disparities goals (<i>Interim</i>)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have had 110 hospitals submit an organizational gap analysis for safety disparities. In addition, hospitals began submitting data by race and ethnicity for UE-ICU and/or CLABSI, with 50% of network hospitals now submitting this data. Submission of this quantitative and qualitative data is hugely helpful as we determine strengths and opportunities for this work. Thank you to our network hospitals for their efforts in driving this important work!
<p>100% of hospitals with CEO/Top Ped. Leaders attending two ESS culture events (<i>Interim</i>)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We held our first in-person CEO/Top Pediatric Leader Convening in over five years and shared some incredible learnings with our network's senior leaders. In addition, we offered three CEO webinars within the interim goal period. Nearly half of our network hospitals ensured their CEO/TPL attended two of these opportunities to meet this goal. <p>80% of hospitals submitting stratified DART data (<i>Interim</i>)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nearly 90 hospitals started submitting their stratified Days Away, Restricted or Transferred (DART) data to SPS. This enhanced visibility to serious employee harm across the network will help SPS target our strategies and interventions for keeping employees of our children's hospitals safer.
<p>75% of hospitals achieving 10% reduction in CLABSI</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> While we saw an increase in CLABSI outcomes in 2022, hospitals have been refocusing on existing prevention efforts. Our CLABSI network outcomes chart currently has eight points below the centerline that the SPS team is actively investigating. We plan to share more details of our findings in the coming weeks.
<p>75% of hospitals achieving 20% reduction in UE-ICU</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have seen yet another reduction in UE-ICU. Beginning in August 2022, the SPS Network chart was shifted down, resulting in a 10% reduction. Special thank you to our network hospitals in working hard to continue driving improvement in UE.
<p>75% of hospitals achieving their Hospital Selected Goal</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hospitals have completed all content webinars for their Hospital Selected Goal (HSG) HAC. Currently, hospitals are actively participating in workgroups and mentorships for their HSG, while utilizing the SPS HSG Workbook. We are almost halfway to the network meeting this goal.
<p>30% Network-wide reduction of SSER</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hospitals began submitting SSER data to SPS in 2022. We continue to monitor this data closely and learn from hospitals who are seeing reductions in SSER.
<p>10% Network-wide reduction of DART 20% Network-wide reduction of PBE-DART</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We kicked off an improvement cohort dedicated to reducing serious employee harm from overexertion (OE) and are learning from this group of executives, senior leaders and unit leaders on how to effectively align key stakeholders in local systems to support OE prevention. In addition to executing a year-long "All Teach, All Learn" series covering a myriad of patient behavioral events (PBE) employee harm prevention topics, we are analyzing newly available stratified DART data to support strategic development of our upcoming PBE-related improvement work. Our network's Serious Employee Harm (DART) chart has more than eight data points below the centerline that the SPS team is currently investigating.
<p>Regional Goal: participation in a milestone-based safety improvement challenge</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All 13 regions have collectively aligned on 1-2 Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA) tests of improvement to be shared among their hospitals, with the objective to measure improvement in a network priority area. Thanks to all teams who have begun to submit data for their region's shared measures to determine the effectiveness of the PDSA.
