In 2013, the OCHA Research collaborative Task Force was formed under Nick's leadership and is the first statewide children's focused research collaborative of its kind. Currently four projects are underway that are dramatically improving outcomes for children. Prior to his work with OCHA, Nick served as the first ever director of external relations for the Ohio Business Roundtable (BRT), a partnership of the chief executives of the state's major businesses. Before joining the BRT, Nick represented organized medicine on behalf of the Ohio State Medical Association (OSMA) and their physician members. Nick is a 1990 graduate of the College of William and Mary in Virginia, where he studied both government and history. Nick and his wife, Megan, are the parents of four sons – Kuyper, Duke, Ike and Drake – and live in Upper Arlington, Ohio.
