This interactive event will include: (i) an overview of LAPPA's model laws that pertain to a specific topic; (ii) a live moderated discussion with a panel of experts; and (iii) plenty of opportunity for Q & A throughout the session. The Overdose Prevention and Treatment in Correctional Settings Knowledge Lab, scheduled for September 12th at 2:00 p.m., features:

These speakers will discuss the model laws and other relevant materials, demonstrating both how states have used the models to increase access to treatment and reduce overdose deaths, and also how model laws can assist jurisdictions generally in addressing substance use disorders.
