Last year, more than 30 of our members volunteered in various ways to help. Your efforts are critical to the strength and longevity of the San Diego Chapter. It takes a village!

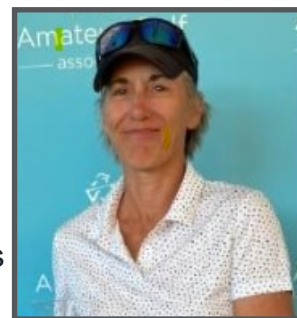

Our Chapter in 2025

Last year, 2025 was another successful year for the San Diego LPGA Amateurs Chapter. We ended the year with 187 members. The Chapter held 35 golf events, including weekend, weekday, skills clinics and education, with over 1,000 players participating.

In 2025, we continued to offer members green fees at a break-even basis, award gift cards and prizes at events, and subsidize food and beverages at a few signature events such as the Membership Event, Chapter Championship, Partner Eclectic, 6-6-6 Devilish Duel, Turkey Ball and Holiday tournament.

As in 2025, the Chapter's 2026 Net Income is again budgeted to be at a slight deficit and the cash reserves that have been built up over the least few years have been reduced by the subsidies referenced. The money brought in by sponsorships and drawings allows us to continue to offset food/beverage costs at the events noted.

in 2026 we are continuing to see increases in green fees and food prices. Your San Diego Board of Directors routinely discusses pricing and tries to manage the event fees to an acceptable level for our members.

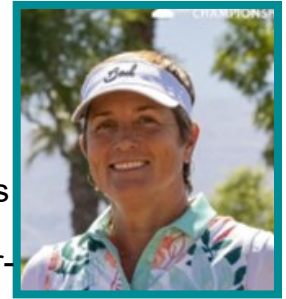

Guide to 2026 Chapter Events and Competitions

For 2026, we are bringing back our most popular events and golf courses, making some changes to our Signature events, adding a new year-long competition, and Cal Cup 2026 will be hosted in Southern California this year, so we are introducing a new qualification process to represent our Chapter in November. Good stuff in 2026!

Weekday Events—We host one weekday event per month at various golf courses, including some moderately priced courses. These events usually occur on Monday or Wednesday to avoid conflicts with local women’s club play days. Golf courses include Cottonwood, Links at the Lakehouse, the Vineyard, Admiral Baker, and more! Cathy Wright is our Weekday events organizer and is always open to feedback and recommendations.

Weekend Events —We typically host two weekend events per month. This could include one of our Signature events. These events usually take place on Sundays due to limited tee times, slower pace of play, and higher greens fees on Saturdays. NEW IN 2026

ACE OF ACES Competition—This year, we have introduced a fun new competition. This is a gross and net competition. There are (10) designated events, and the lowest gross and lowest net player from each event will be the Month Aces. If you earn a Month Ace, you are entered into the Ace of Aces competition taking place on Sunday, November 1st at Singing Hills to compete to be our Chapter's Ace of Aces Champions.

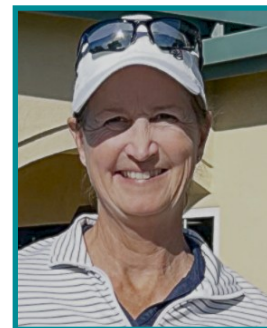
CAL CUP 2026

Friday, November 6th & Saturday, November 7th – Anaheim Hills Golf Course

San Diego will be represented by 12 players competing in a 2-day match-play format against other California/Nevada chapters to become the 2026 Cal Cup Champions. There is a qualification process to earn a spot on the San Diego team.

San Diego will be hosting Cal Cup in 2028.

Terms of Competition and Local Rules (Hard Card)

The Rules of Golf, as approved by the USGA govern play, supplemented by the following:

Pace of Play Policy:

Groups must play at a prompt pace and keep up with the group in front of them, finishing no more than 15 minutes behind the group ahead.

Your Group is **BEHIND** if:

- On a par 3, the group arrives at the tee after the group ahead has completed teeing off on the next hole.
- On a par 4, the group arrives at the tee, and the hole is empty.
- On a par 5, the group arrives at the tee, and the group ahead is on the putting green.

Groups that are out of position for any reason (ball searches, rules issues, etc.) are expected to return to position within no more than 2 holes. Groups that are behind may be subject to penalties under Rule 5.6.

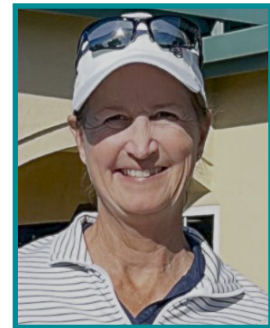
It is recommended that the player make the stroke in no more than 40 seconds after she is (or should be) able to play without interference or distraction, and the player should usually be able to play more quickly than that.

Maximum Score: Under Rule 21.2, the maximum gross score for each hole set by the Committee is **10**. A player who does **NOT** hole out for any reason gets the maximum score for the hole. Once a player reaches 10 strokes on a hole, she should pick up to assist pace of play.

Additional Relief Option for Lost Ball or Out of Bounds: Model Local Rule E-5 is in effect. When a player's ball is lost or out of bounds and a provisional ball has not been played, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance (returning to the spot of the previous shot): For TWO penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping a ball within two club-lengths of the edge of the fairway nearest where the ball is determined to be lost or OB, no closer to the hole.

Terms of Competition and Local Rules (Hard Card)

Relief from Sod Seams: Model Local Rule F-7. Player may take free relief under Rule 16.1 when a ball lies on a sod seam, or it interferes with the area of intended swing. No free relief for interference with the player's stance. Drop within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief, no closer to the hole.

Aeration Holes: If the player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole, she may take free relief under Rule 16.1 as follows: in the General Area, the player may drop a ball within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief, no closer to the hole. On the putting green, the player may place a ball at the nearest point of complete relief. If the ball comes to rest in another aeration hole, the player may take relief again.

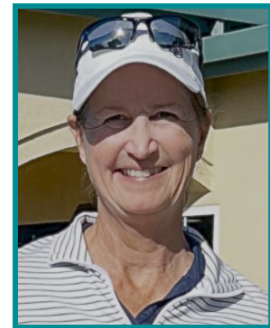
Preferred Lies (Winter Rules): Players will be notified prior to starting play if Preferred Lies is in effect. When a player's ball lies in the General Area cut to fairway height or less (fairways and fringe of green only), the player may take relief once by placing the ball in the General Area within one club-length of where the ball lies, no closer to the hole.

Reminder on Rangefinders: Distance Measuring Devices such as GPS, smartphone apps, and range finders are permitted under the Rules, but if your device measures any other condition such as slope or wind speed, that capability must be disabled or turned off.

Gimme Policy: Although not in accordance with the Rules of Golf, for our routine play days (not major championships, qualifiers, or events), we do allow groups to agree to give putts (aka gimmes) within "the leather" (i.e. the length of the standard putter grip, **around 10.5 inches**). This makes the round more enjoyable, a little less competitive, and speeds play.

Terms of Competition and Local Rules (Hard Card)

Scoring Procedures: We will be using the Golf Genius (GG) App for live scoring for all events.

Steps:

1. One person in the foursome will enter scores into the GG App.
2. Download the Golf Genius App if you don't already have it.
3. Open the App and sign in with your Team GGID, located on your scorecard and/or the tee sheet.
4. One other player will STILL need to keep a physical scorecard tracking the team's score.
5. At the end of the round, the person with the scorecard will read off the scores to the GG App scorer.
6. Then, the GG App scorer will read back to ensure accurate input.
7. This should take less than 5 minutes.
8. Once you have verified all scores and made any corrections, press the Sandwich Menu  at the top left and log out. The scores are automatically uploaded to the tournament event in Golf Genius.
9. **Do not post to GHIN.** The Committee will post to GHIN for you after your round. GHIN will automatically post your score using Net Double Bogey for any holes not completed.
