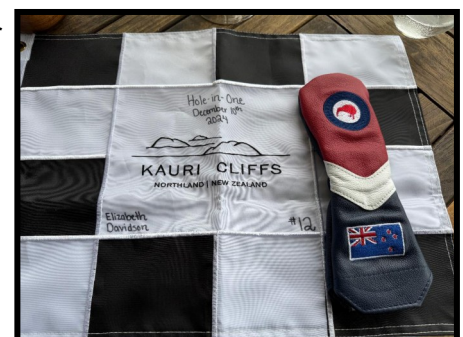

I used an 8 iron and executed perfectly, hitting the hill on the right. 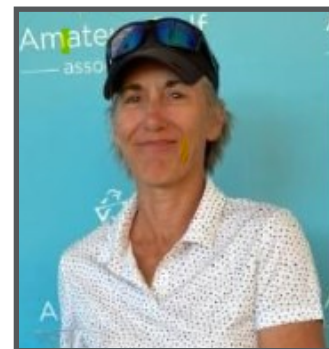
Our Chapter in 2024

Last year, 2024, was another successful year for the San Diego LPGA Amateurs Chapter. We exceeded our sponsorship goals and ended the year with 196 members.

The Chapter held 33 golf events, including weekend, weekday, and education, with 1,100 players participating.

Financially, our 2024 Net Income was favorable to budget due to Sponsor contributions and our successful Opportunity Drawings, which many of you participated in. In 2024, we continued to offer members green fees at a break-even basis, award gift cards and prizes at events, and subsidize food and beverages at a few signature events such as the Membership Event, Chapter Championship, Partner Eclectic, 6-6-6- Devilish Duel, Turkey Ball and Holiday tournament.

As in 2024, the Chapter's 2025 Net Income is again budgeted to be a deficit; we have built cash reserves over the past few years and would like to return that cash reserve to our stakeholders — our members - over the next two years. We plan to continue to offset food/beverage costs at the events noted. Due to inflation and tee time demand, golf courses continue raising green fees and food prices. Your San Diego Board of Directors routinely discusses pricing and tries to manage the event fees to an acceptable level for our members.



Your 2025 San Diego Chapter Board of Directors



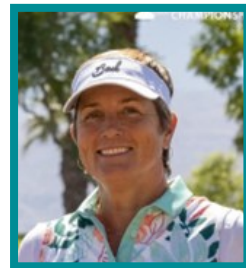

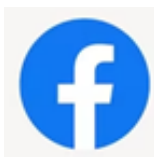

Sarah Yan

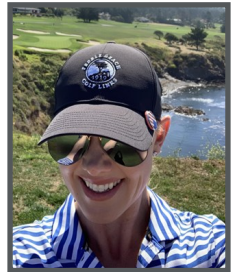
Sarah is a dual member in the Orange County Chapter, she knows Cindy Mason, and played in the Cal Cup year.

—Elsa's husband and son play in a club, and she wants to be ready before heading to the course with them. We got you! Welcome.

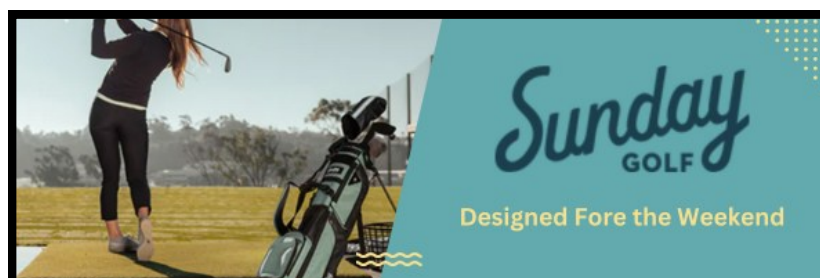


Barbara Savaglio

Guide to 2025 Events and Competitions

For 2025, we recognize greens fees have gone up! We also know that while many members of a part of other clubs and organizations, the hope is that the benefits of playing with fellow LPGA Amateur San Diego members will encourage your participation in our events. If you are a new member, we will pair you with some Chapter veterans to help make sure you feel comfortable, have fun, and meet our members.

New Courses This Year: San Vicente, Cross Creek, Dos Osos, Riverwalk, Pala Mesa & Journey Pechanga.

Weekday Events—We host one-weekday event per month at various golf courses, including some moderately priced courses. These events usually occur on Monday or Wednesday so as not to conflict with local women's club play days.

Weekend Events – We typically host two-weekend events per month. This could include one of our Signature events. These events usually take place on Sundays due to limited tee times, slower pace of play, and higher greens fees on Saturdays.

Signature Events – Our most popular events! These events are always fun. They usually include a theme and a fun competition and end with a fun 19th hole!

Here are the remaining Signature events happening this year:

- **Member Guest Events**—We host two member-guest events every year. The first will be held on March 30th at Native Oaks. Bring a guest who we hope will want to join our Chapter after playing a day of golf with us! These events are always fun.
- **Aloha Ball** – Sunday, June 29 at the Encinitas Ranch Golf Course. Dress in Hawaiian attire; hopefully, your group will not lose the “Aloha Ball!”
- **Play For P.I.N.K.** – Sunday, October 5 at Journey Pechanga. Join us and make a difference in the fight and support breast cancer research.
- **Devilish Duel**, better known as “666” – Sunday, October 19 at The Vineyard (new venue) This is one of our most popular partner events. Guide to 2025 Events and Competitions

Competitions

- **Double Trouble** – Sunday, March 9 - Enagic Golf Club at Eastlake. This partner event plays 9 holes of best ball followed by 9 holes of alternate shot. It was very popular last year. We will find one for you if you don't have a partner.
- **Chapter Championship** a/k/a “the CHA CHA” – June 7 & 8 at Rancho Bernardo Inn (RBI). Presented by Vessel, this is our Chapter's premiere competition event played over two consecutive days, resulting in the crowning of our two Chapter Champions, Gross and Net.
- **The Eclectic** – Sunday, September 14 & Sunday, September 21 - Twin Oaks Golf Course. This is a partner event where your twosome team has an opportunity to improve your net score from the first Sunday to the following Sunday. It's an early shotgun start each day, followed by an awards luncheon on September 21st. If you don't have a partner, we will find one for you. Both partners should play on both days to increase your team's chances of winning.



Please check out our weekly eBlast for event information and the calendar of events, which our members receive on Tuesday mornings. This information can also be found in the Quick Links Section on the homepage of the Chapter website. The eBlast will include a calendar of the events scheduled for the season. Some of our events are very popular and fill quickly, so don't wait to register. We have limited spots for every event, so register early. 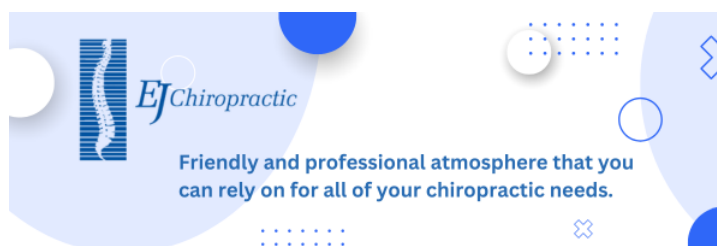

Terms of Competition and Local Rules (Hard Card)

The Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA govern play, supplemented by the following:

Pace of Play Policy:

Groups must play at a prompt pace and keep up with the group in front of them, finishing no more than 15 minutes behind the group ahead.

Your Group is **BEHIND** if:

- ⇒ On a par 3, the group arrives at the tee after the group ahead has completed teeing off on the next hole.
- ⇒ On a par 4, the group arrives at the tee, and the hole is empty.
- ⇒ On a par 5, the group arrives at the tee, and the group ahead is on the putting green.

Groups out of position for any reason (ball searches, rule issues, etc.) are expected to return to position within no more than two holes. Groups that are behind may be subject to penalties under Rule 5.6.

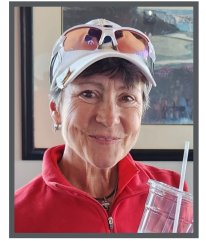
It is recommended that the player make the stroke in no more than 40 seconds after she is (or should be) able to play without interference or distraction, and the player should usually be able to play more quickly than that.

Maximum Score: Under Rule 21.2, the maximum gross score for each hole set by the Committee is **10**. A player who does **NOT** hole out for any reason gets the maximum score for the hole. Once a player reaches 10 strokes on a hole, she should pick up to assist the pace of play.

Additional Relief Option for Lost Ball or Out of Bounds: Model Local Rule E-5 is in effect. When a player's ball is lost or out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance (returning to the spot of the previous shot): For TWO penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping a ball within two club-lengths of the edge of the fairway nearest where the ball is determined to be lost or OB, no closer to the hole.

Relief from Sod Seams: Model Local Rule F-7. A player may take free relief under Rule 16.1 when a ball lies on a sod seam or it interferes with the area of the intended swing—no free relief for interference with the player's stance. Drop within one club length of the nearest point of complete relief, no closer to the hole.

Terms of Competition and Local Rules (Hard Card)

Aeration Holes: If the player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole, she may take free relief under Rule 16.1 as follows: in the General Area, the player may drop the ball within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief, no closer to the hole. On the putting green, the player may place a ball at the nearest point of complete relief. If the ball comes to rest in another aeration hole, the player may take relief again.

Preferred Lies (Winter Rules): Players will be notified prior to starting play if Preferred Lies is in effect. When a player's ball lies in the General Area cut to Fairway height or less (fairways and fringe of green only), the player may take relief once by placing the ball in the General Area within one club length of where the ball lies, no closer to the hole.

Reminder on Rangefinders: Distance-measuring devices such as GPS, smartphone apps, and range finders are permitted under the Rules, but if your device measures any other condition, such as Slope or wind speed, that capability must be disabled or turned off.

Gimme Policy:

Although not in accordance with the Rules of Golf, for our routine play days (not major championships, qualifiers, or events), we do allow groups to agree to give putts (aka gimmes) within "the leather" (i.e., the length of the standard putter grip, **around 10.5 inches**). This makes the round more enjoyable, a little less competitive, and speeds up play. The use of gimmes is not required, however.

Scoring Procedures:

We will use the Golf Genius (GG) app for live scoring for all events.

Steps:

- 1) One person in the foursome will enter scores into the GG App.
- 2) Download the Golf Genius app if you don't already have it.
- 3) Open the app and sign in with your Team GGID, located on your scorecard and/or the tee sheet.
- 4) One other player will STILL need to keep a physical scorecard tracking the team's score.
- 5) At the end of the round, the GG App scorer will read the scores to the physical scorecard keeper. Other players should pay attention to ensure their scores are accurately recorded.
- 6) This should take less than 5 minutes.
- 7) **Do not post to GHIN.** The Committee will post to GHIN for you after your round. GHIN will automatically post your score using Net Double Bogey.

When you play an eligible event, you earn participation points; if you finish in the Top 10 of those participating in the Players Cup, you earn additional points. At the end of the season, the Top 10 finishers in each division, NET and/or GROSS earn money.

It is easy. Just register using the Registration Link below, pay \$20 each for one division or both, and play in our events.

Throughout the season, you can track how you are doing after each event on our website or via Golf Genius.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE NEW CHANGES FOR THE 2025 SEASON:

- The addition of an end-of-season Championship Tourney for the Top 8 players in both Net and Gross Divisions.
- All players in an eligible event will earn participation points for attending, regardless of whether they earn finishing place points by being in the Top 10.
- ALL rounds in which a player earns points will count toward a player's total (not just the best 8 rounds as done previously).

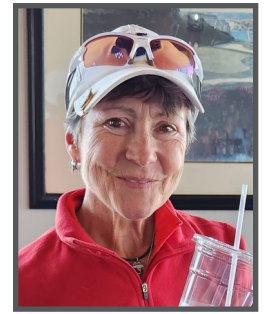
