Congratulations Cindy!

Cindy Mason won Low Net in the First Flight this past weekend at the LPGA Amateurs Championship Final held in Pleasanton, CA. This two-day, 36-hole event was held at the Callippe Preserve Golf Course and attended by 100 golfers from all over the country. There were four flights, Championship, First, Second and Third. Cindy's flight had a 13.1 to approximately an 18 index.

Cindy is most proud of the fact that she finished **fourth gross overall**. Yes, that was fourth out of approximately 100 golfers!

On day one, she shot an 83, which tied her for the lead in her flight with another player from the Madison, Wisconsin Chapter, Susan Crowson. On day two, they were paired, and were neck and neck all day long, and maintained their lead over the rest of the field. Cindy was down one stroke on the 18th, and Susan made a great chip onto the green just three feet from the hole and made the putt. Susan took Low Gross by only two strokes in their flight. Cindy's most memorable shot over the two days was on day two, Hole 6, with a 40-foot putt for a birdie. She also could not say enough kind words about the women she played with at the tournament.

The weather was perfect over the two days, in the low 80s, but a bit windy in the afternoon. The course is in the East Bay area in Northern California near where her family lives, and she is used to it being much hotter that time of the year.

Cindy had never played the course and did not play a practice round. But, she said, "three days of straight golf can be a bit much if you get my drift." The ladies she played with had played the day before and told her the front, and back nine played like two different courses and that the back nine will eat your lunch. Unfortunately, Cindy said, "they were correct." On Day 2, there was almost a 30-minute wait to start Hole 10, and it took them six hours to complete the round. The back nine had many holes you were forced to lay up, and accuracy was more important than distance. The back nine also had many elevation changes, with wind greatly impacting the round.

When asked if she celebrated? She said, "I attended the awards dinner." She added that her family followed her status all day via Golf Genius. When she saw them later, they were nice enough to listen to every excruciating detail of her day. "I am fortunate" she says.

Cindy felt very lucky to receive so many well wishes from the ladies in the SD Chapter.

Ashley Riggs-Zeigen and Mindy Sam Davis Playing in the Annual Big Brothers Big Sisters Golf Marathon

On June 24, Ashley Riggs-Zeigen and Mindy Sam Davis played golf for **ten** hours at Singing Hills Golf Resort to raise money for Big Brothers Big Sisters.

This was the 29th Annual Big Brothers Big Sisters Golf Marathon, and over the years, the event has raised enough to help 74,000 kids. It's amazing how a group of people coming together can have a life-changing impact on many kids and our community.

Sixty golfers this year collectively raised **\$292,352**, which will all go directly to support nearly half of the kids on the waitlist for mentors! Funds go towards screening and training adult volunteers, along with monthly support, so at-risk youth have access to one-on-one mentoring and an opportunity to achieve their potential.

"One of the things I love most about this event is that Sycuan and other sponsors cover all of the expenses, so 100% of your donations go directly to support kids," said Ashley. By the way, Ashley played 65 holes in 10 hours, with 2 birdies and 18 pars.

This is the first time Mindy played in the event, and she was inspired to play by Ashley, a seasoned supporter of the event and a former Big Sister. "The Big Brothers Big Sisters golf marathon event was amazing!" said Mindy. "I was inspired and humbled by the experience." Mindy got to meet board members and long-time marathon golfers and learned so much more about the organization.

Mindy played 67 holes (five holes shy of 4 rounds), making 2 birdies, 21 pars, 28 bogies, 18 one-putts, 40 two-putts, 8 three-putts, and **no** four-putts. She says she drank plenty of water and electrolytes to stay hydrated in the 89F-degree weather.

Ashley and Mindy are asking everyone to play in the 30th-Anniversary celebration next year!

How to Avoid Heat Related Injuries and More on the Rules!

See if you know the answer to these Rules Situations:

Q: If you're facing a long carry-over water, is it legal to avoid losing a ball by taking a penalty off the tee and heading straight to the drop zone?

The Situation:

Bobbie was playing in a stroke-play event, and she came to the 17th hole four shots ahead of the field but with only one ball left. Not knowing if the rules allowed for borrowing a ball from another player and facing a long par 3 over water, Bobbie asked if she could bypass hitting her tee shot and head directly to the drop zone across the water, lying 3, to prevent the possibility of losing her last ball. She would still have a 2 shot lead, with a much safer shot to the green. Legal?

A: Creative, yes. Legal, no. Think of the Drop Zone as an exclusive nightclub called, well, "The Drop Zone," where you can't just talk your way in – you must be on the guest list.

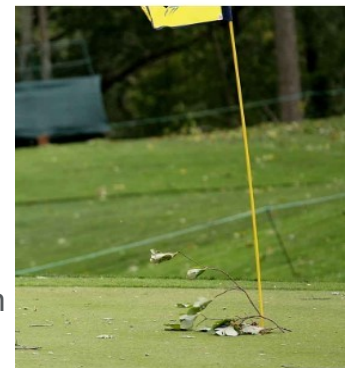
Under rule 17.1b, access to the drop zone requires a ball to come to rest in the affiliated penalty area. And as for borrowing a ball, The "1 ball rule", Model Local Rule G-4, is rarely in effect other than for elite professional and amateur competitions. So assuming it wasn't, Bobbie could have borrowed a ball from another player if she ran out.



Q: Can I use debris on the green as a backstop when I'm putting?

The Situation:

Marie was playing a match the other day and had a slick downhill putt to win a hole. If the putt doesn't hit the hole, it will roll off the green. The wind had deposited some debris – leaves and sticks – near the hole, which she decided to keep in place, since they might slow the ball down in the event she misses her putt. As her putt rolled toward the cup, it became apparent that it would indeed miss. Her opponent, Vida rushed in to clear the debris, and sure enough, Marie's ball rolled back into the fairway. Did Marie break a rule by leaving the debris there, or did Vida, by moving it?



A: Marie is in the clear since a player is entitled to play the course as she finds it. Yes, even if she's leaving loose impediments in place to act as a potential backstop. Meanwhile, Vida has breached Rule 11.3 – you can't take action to deliberately affect what's happening with a ball once it's in motion. Hence, the penalty - Loss of Hole and Vida owes Marie a Bloody Mary or Michelob Ultra, whatever she's in the mood to drink.

Golfing in the Heat and How to Keep Your Cool!

As temperatures and humidity rise it's important to know the signs and symptoms of heat illnesses and how to protect yourself.

Beat the heat

Golfers who spend several hours out on the course on a hot day put themselves at higher risk for elevated body temperature, dehydration and heat illness, which can essentially impair not only their performance, but also overall health. You can take action to reduce these risks by following these tips:

- **Get early tee times.** Golf earlier in the day before the temperature rises.
- **Don't over-exert yourself.** Minimize the duration and intensity of your movements as much as possible.
- **Seek shade whenever possible.** Stand under a tree and get out of the sun during your partner's shot.
- **Wear light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.** Sweat is more likely to get soaked up in tighter clothing before it can be carried away from your body, causing you to sweat more and increasing your risk of dehydration and heat illness.
- **Stay hydrated.** Having a beer or two during your golf game isn't the worst thing in the world, but water or sports drinks should be the primary fluids golfers turn to when it's hot and humid. Sports drinks provide electrolytes your body is losing and carbohydrates to give you energy.
- **Grab a cart.** Being able to drive a cart instead of walking the course will minimize heat production and prevent heat illness from occurring.

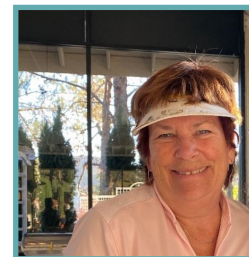

HEAT RASH	
• Red clusters of small blisters that look like pimples on the skin (usually on the neck, chest, groin, or in elbow creases)	• Stay in a cool, dry place • Keep the rash dry • Use powder (like baby powder) to soothe the rash

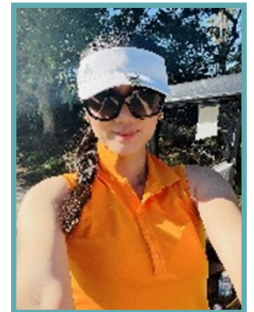


Paula Smith (new last quarter)

Meet the Board—Q&A with Jane Langdon

Each quarter we highlight one of our Chapter Board members so you get to know them and have a better understanding of how the Board operates.

Where are you from originally and how long have you lived in the San Diego area?
