If you ever experience this, please inform your chapter leaders or headquarters so it can be addressed right away.

I personally spent several hours at the beautiful Hole 11, watching the groups come through and execute amazing shots. I also visited with several of our members who volunteered and ran into many of you who were spectating. Cal Cup 2022

WHEN: Saturday, November 12 & Sunday, November 13, 2022

WHERE: Rancho Bernardo Inn

FORMAT: Match Play

The Cal Cup is a team match-play competition between the California Chapters of LPGA Amateurs. This year there will be eight chapters competing for the coveted Chapter Crown. Each team has twelve members.

Day 1 is partner day. Team members will be put into three teams of two and play alternate shot against another team. The remaining three teams of two will play four-ball against another team.

Day 2 is individual day. Players will be matched up to play individual match play against another team.

A 12-player team will represent the San Diego Chapter in this two-day event. To be eligible to represent and play on the San Diego team, you must have participated in three chapter events from December 1, 2021 – June 1, 2022. To qualify for the team, members must play in four designated matches against another San Diego chapter member between July 1 and September 1, 2022. Best records prevail.

Registration for the Cal Cup Qualifiers will open on June 7, 2022. The team will be announced by October 1, 2022

Golf Clinics & Education by Karen Bridges



The Welk Resort Rules of Golf, Fun Play, and 19th Hole

On April 30th, we offered a fun Rules and Etiquette clinic followed by 18 holes at the Par 3 Oaks course at The Welk Resort. We had a dozen gals, both new to golf and more experienced, show up to learn and play. We had our own private area on the patio of the 18th hole on the Oaks course.



Even though the clinic was geared towards golfers who were relatively new to golf, I and the other more experienced golfers, also learned many new things. (You're never too old to learn!!) Mary Shepperd educated us on what are the rules and why you should know them, some basics of rules and conduct, and common mistakes golfers make. She also showed the group how to take relief from Abnormal Course Conditions (cart path, ground under repair). She explained and showed how to get your reference point, determine the size of the relief area, and the limits on the location of the relief area. We had some great questions come up during her demo which helped clarify this rule in various situations.



We also were educated on some putting green rules: what happens if a ball moves? What happens if a ball hits another ball, from off the green or on the green?



Congratulations Susan for being a member of the LPGA Amateurs for 25 Years!!!




