When she saw the ball clear the bunker she could see it rolling and then actually saw the ball drop in to the hole. At that point, they all started yelling and cheering. It was pretty fun, "she said, even a couple of holes later we were all still pretty excited."

Cindy added, "what was funny is that this was during the Alternate Shot section of the event and as we left hole #8 the marshal told us we were slightly behind (you know probably behind because of Bonnie and Gaye:)) and to pick up the pace a bit." So as we were driving to hole #9 Karen said, "to pick up the pace it would be helpful if I hit a Hole-in-One." Funny timing.

Cindy's first hole-in-one was July 2020 at Lake Forest Golf and Practice Center. "Let's just say this course is probably not on anyone's bucket list," said Cindy. It is a little executive course where she learned to play golf and often golfed alone as was the case that morning when she got a hole in one hitting the ball 108 yards over a pond with an 8 iron. She had only been golfing two years when that happened and realized how lucky that was. Cindy concluded, "so to have two is really crazy luck."

Recap of the Rules Clinic, Fun Play, and 19th hole at Welks Oaks Course

On Saturday, October 15th, nine of us gals got together at the Welks Resort Golf Club to take advantage of this fun opportunity to learn more about the Rules of Golf from our own Mary Shepperd. Many of you already know of Mary's expertise in this field, but for those members who do not, Mary has over 15 years of experience volunteering as a Rules official in both Northern and Southern California and has worked over 40 USGA national championships, including US Opens and many US Women's Opens.

We met on the patio near the Pro Shop while Mary discussed everything from why you should even know the Rules (there are other reasons beyond the obvious), what are the Rules of Golf and then what are some of the more common mistakes players make.

After a very fast hour, we played 9 of the 18 holes on the Oaks Par 3 course and met back on the patio of the Pro Shop to use our drink tickets at the 19th hole! After all, what is golf without the 19th hole!!

Since many of the attendees have been playing for some time, the discussion got pretty lively and there were many interesting questions about different golf scenarios. We explored when you can actually substitute a ball, three things you can move if a ball is in motion, when you can and cannot use a provisional, and a few other areas of the Rules of Golf.

We all decided that we learned something new and got clarifications for some other Rules that can be confusing.

For anyone interested in attending one of these Clinics, Mary let us know that the USGA will be making some changes to the Rules of Golf in 2023. So, there will be a new Rules of Golf book for 2023 that will be forthcoming.

You will be receiving an update next year regarding these changes and, of course, we will have another Mary Shepperd Rules Clinic for anyone interested. Photos from our day:

Recap of the Skills Clinic by Lori Brock at Stadium Golf on October 23rd

This event was limited to only 5 players so Lori was able to provide enough attention to create an effective learning opportunity for all the players.

Lori went over different chipping and pitching techniques given various distances and lies. She talked about the benefits of learning the technique for a chip and run vs pitching. Then the gals were given the opportunity to practice the technique with Lori assisting each player in fine-tuning it. She then went over the technique of handling downhill chips and runs... those scary shots to which the word "skull shot" is sometimes connected!! The gals practiced these shots and appeared to be mastering them pretty well. No more fear!

The group was interested in what to do with various bad lies and Lori discussed and demonstrated how she recommends handling those.

All in all, lots of instruction, with great cueing, and much time to practice with Lori looking on and helping to hone the technique. We will also be offering more skills clinics at various venues in the coming year for anyone interested in participating.

ANSWERS TO RULES QUESTIONS ON THE PREVIOUS PAGE

1. There is a penalty of 4 strokes. Rule 6.3c; Rule 1.3c(4)

Penalty for Playing Wrong Ball is the General Penalty (2 Strokes in Stroke Play)

Adrienne played the wrong ball twice.

In stroke play, the player must correct the mistake by continuing play with the original ball by playing it as it lies or taking relief under the Rules:

- The stroke made with the wrong ball and any more strokes before the mistake is corrected (including strokes made and any penalty strokes solely from playing that ball) do not count.
- If the player does not correct the mistake before making a stroke to begin another hole or, for the final hole of the round, before returning her scorecard, the player is then disqualified.

2. True. Rule 13.2b(2); Rule 11.2c

- Key word is “deliberate”. If the deflection was accidental, (either by hitting Heather or the flagstick), Pam would play the ball as it lies.
- BUT Heather “deliberately” caused Pam’s ball in motion to hit the flagstick so Rule 11.2c applies. Since Pam’s stroke was made from the Putting Green, the stroke does not count, and the original ball or another ball must be replaced on its original spot (which if not known must be estimated).

And Heather, for breaching Rule 11.2 gets the General Penalty.

Players Cup Update after Golf Club of California

Net Players Cup had two big moves. Nancy Mason covers some ground by moving from 10th to 7th place when she won Low Net with a 71. Lois, meanwhile, vaults from 6th to 2nd place by tying for 2nd low net with Kim Greco. Those were the big movers. All other movers were in the 'down' direction, but only by one place. We only have three events left for someone to catch Soo Lee. It may not be possible, but 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th place are pretty bunched up and ripe for someone to take charge.

Gross Players Cup had two upward moves: Bethany Selan with a 2nd place gross win of 85 jumped from 3rd place to 2nd place in the overall standings while Kim Greco jumps from T10 to sole 9th place with her 89. However, Crystal Horiuchi shot a low gross of 79 for the day to take 1st and stay in the lead in the overall standings by 17.5 points. With three events left it'll prove difficult to catch Crystal, but there's some fight left for 2nd and 3rd place between Deb Finlon and Bethany Selan. 4th, 5th and 6th places have a potential to change as well.
