State of the Chapter by Susan Crawford

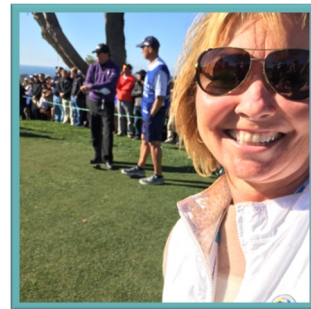
The Chapter had a very successful 2021, overachieving our membership and sponsorship goals. We ended the year with 192 members, recruited 58 new members retained 91% of our 2020 members.

The chapter held 30 weekend golf events, two clinics, and 11 monthly weekday events, with an average of 35 members playing each event and a total of 1,155 participants at our weekend and clinic events.

Financially, our 2021 Net Income was favorable to budget due to higher membership dues, sponsor contributions, and our successful Opportunity Drawings that many of you participated in at our events. In 2021, we continued to offer members green fees at a break-even basis, award gift cards and prizes at events, and subsidize food and beverages at a few signature events.

The Chapter's 2022 Net Income is budgeted to be a deficit; we have built cash reserves over the past few years and would like to return that cash reserve to our stakeholders - our members over the next few years. We plan to do that by offsetting the food/beverage costs at a few of the events, such as the Membership Event in April and a slight increase to prizes throughout the year.

Our Chapter receives a very small portion of your membership dues; our sponsors are critical to continue the success of our Chapter. Please take time to patronize our sponsors and to thank them then and at the events they attend.

Guide to 2022 Competitions by Stacey Hayashi

Sometimes competition can be that push for you to achieve more...Or sometimes competition is another way to put your skills to the test and try to play your game better than you did the day before. Whatever the reason... One very important thing to note is our competitions are for ALL SKILLS LEVELS OF GOLFERS. Competitions are not for just low handicap players.



As a member of the LPGA Amateurs, you have the opportunity to participate in three types of competitions: San Diego Chapter, Regional, and LPGA Amateurs National Competitions.

San Diego Chapter Competition

Chapter Championship: Our “Cha Cha.” This is our chapter’s Signature Premier event. Once a year, we crown our Chapter Champions for the year: One Low Gross Champion Over the Field & one Low Net Champion Over the Field. This is a 2-day individual stroke competition that will take place this year at Rancho Bernardo Inn over the dates of June 25-26, 2022. Flights are set up based on the number of players in the field and the handicap indexes. Registration will open in May 2022.

Regional Competition

Cal Cup: This is a team match-play competition between the California chapters. A 12-player team will represent the San Diego Chapter in this two-day event. There is a local qualification process and minimum eligibility requirements to qualify for the team to represent our Chapter. Cal Cup 2022 will take place on November 12-13, 2022, at Rancho Bernardo Inn. (The qualification process & eligibility requirements will be communicated to our members by mid-February)

LPGA Amateurs National Competitions

LPGA Western Championship Sectional: Individual stroke competition in Ak-Chin, AZ on May 6-7, 2022. Registration opens on February 23, 2022.

LPGA Scramble Open: Team event taking place in Lake Geneva, WI, June 4-5, 2022. This is a team competition with a scramble format.

LPGA Amateurs Championship Open: This event will take place in Pleasanton, CA, on July 29-30, 2022. You must place in the Western Championship Sectional event (listed above) to qualify.

LPGA Cup Series Regional Cup Qualifier: Team event in Sparks, NV on September 17-18, 2022. This event is a qualifier for the LPGA Cup Finals. Team match play format. Registration will open on July 6, 2022.

LPGA Cup Final: Team event in Marble Falls, TX on October 29-30, 2022. The team must qualify from the Regional Cup Qualifier (listed above).

Real-Time Players Cup Results at your Fingertips Step-by-Step Easy Peasy Instructions

1. Open the Golf Genius (GG) App



2. Login using GGID (Not Email)

- For Net Division GGID = 2022NETPC
- For Gross Division GGID = 2022GROSSPC

3. Select "Member Portal."

- Home button – Provides the Rules for the Players Cup
- Player Info button – List all the members participating in the Players Cup
- Results button
 - Tournament Results – Shows the results from each Event individually. You can toggle between Events thus far in the small white box at the top
 - 2022 Net Season Points – This shows you the current standings for all qualifying Events.

4. Log out. You can log back in using the other GGID to see those results

Meet the Board—Q&A with Connie Pasterkiewicz

Each quarter we highlight one of our Chapter Board members so you get to know them and have a better understanding of how the Board operates.

When did you begin playing golf?

My husband Ken introduced me to golf when I met him. He played golf as a “filler” game, and I thought I might enjoy doing it with him. One day, Ken and his friend, Jim Wright, hatched an idea that if they introduced Cathy and me, we would be more amenable to driving for them when they went hang gliding. This involves driving them to the launch site, spending all day waiting for them to launch, land, and then picking them up. So they introduced us, and that was the last time they saw us on a hang-gliding day. After that, we started playing golf and riding bikes every weekend. on Balboa, I pulled a shot over the fence on the last hole; it hit a car...I paid \$4.50 to play golf and \$100 for the windshield!

Skiing, bicycling, hiking, playing cards, dining out, theater, spending time with my daughter, and walking the dog!

How and when did you get involved with the board?

Counting on Emotion: Tax Season Fraud

As tax season rolls around, it's best to be aware of fraud trends that crop up during this time. This appears to be an especially popular time for phishers to hit the unsuspecting public.

Taxpayers are routinely subject to assault with spam and malware infections. The emotional triggers around filing taxes and communicating with authorities can prompt emotional responses.

Those committing fraud in the tax season count on reactions to:

- Anxiety – being faced with the (false) accusation of a rejected/fraudulent statement and wanting to rectify the issue
- Sense of obligation – having to comply with the civil obligation to report to the taxation authorities

Campaigns extend into May and June with fake returns and rejected/fraudulent statements.

Malware attachments sent in the guise of tax statements, phishing emails from alleged tax authorities, and online tax-filing scams are among the potentially damaging exchanges. People can be tricked into thinking they are “opening an online account, updating their personal information, contesting a fraudulent statement, or receiving a refund.”

If you receive suspicious email, it's best to delete it. A file sent in a fake email can be what is known as a Trojan executable. Check the file extension (.pdf followed by .exe). When opened, the malware will infect the PC. Emails that appear to come from an online tax filing service can contain a malware download disguised as a .zip file.

If you believe you've been the victim of identity theft, you can report the issue to a credit reporting agency to put an initial fraud alert on your credit report. A fraud alert is free. (You must provide proof of your identity. The company you call must tell the other credit reporting companies about your alert.)

Being aware of potential scams is a good first step in fighting against fraud. For more information about these and other tax scams, visit the Internal Revenue Service website at www.irs.gov.

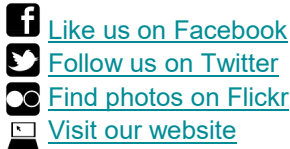
