State of the Chapter by Susan Crawford

Last year, 2022, was another successful year for the San Diego LPGA Amateurs Chapter, overachieving our membership and sponsorship goals. We ended the year with 209 members and had 64 new members join in 2022.

The Chapter held 43 golf events, including weekend, weekday, and education, with a total participation of 1,433 players, up 24% from the prior year.

Financially, our 2022 Net Income was favorable to budget due to Sponsor contributions and our successful Opportunity Drawings that many of you participated. In 2022, we continued to offer members green fees at a break-even basis, award gift cards and prizes at events, and subsidize food and beverages at a few signature events such as the Chapter Championship, Partner Eclectic, 6-6-6 Devilish Duel, Turkey Shoot, and Holiday tournament.



The Chapter's 2023 Net Income is budgeted to be a deficit; we have built cash reserves over the past few years and would like to return that cash reserve to our stakeholders - our members over the next few years. We plan to do that by continuing to offset food/beverage costs at the events noted above and the Membership Event in April. Due to inflation, hiring challenges, and tee time demand, golf courses are continuing to raise prices on both green fees and food. The San Diego Board of Directors routinely discuss pricing and tries to manage the event fees to an acceptable level for our members.

Our Chapter receives a very small portion of your annual membership dues, our sponsors are critical to continue the success of our Chapter. Please take time to patronize our sponsors and thank them at events they attend.

COMPETITION – For those who like to compete, Get Ready!

Chapter Championship a/k/a the CHA CHA – The Crossings, June 3 & 4. This is our premiere Chapter event played over two consecutive days resulting in the crowning of our two Chapter Champions – One champion is low gross over the field, the second Champion is low net over the field. The event is followed by an awards luncheon to recognize our flight winners and champions.



The Eclectic – Twin Oaks, July 23 & 30. This partner event takes place over two consecutive Sundays. On the second Sunday, your duo has the opportunity to improve your net score from the first Sunday. It's an early start on both days followed by an awards luncheon on the 30th. You must be able to play both Sundays. If you don't have a partner, we can find one for you.

This year, both our Chapter and LPGA AMS Corporate will be adding new events to the calendar.

Double Trouble – Enagic Golf Club at Eastlake, March 26. Partner event – 9 holes of best ball, 9 holes alternate shot. If you don't have a partner, we can find one for you.

Four Score – Team competition will run from February 20 – August 21. You can choose your team, or we will find one for you. Team members will play in as many eligible events as they want, and the (4) lowest net scores from each team member during the designated dates will count towards a combined team total.

The Big Scramble – Golf Club of California, May 7. This is a foursome scramble with a twist. You can choose your team, or we can find one for you.

LPGA AMS Team Championship – World Golf Village, Florida, June 23 & 24 – This is a partner event – Two days of better ball & alternate shot.

The weekly eBlast that you receive on Tuesday morning from our Chapter lists events that are open for registration and provides important Save the Dates and information about when events will open for registration. Golf Clinics & Education *by Karen Bridges*

Welcome to all the new members, and welcome back to all others! I want to review our Terms and Conditions and Local Rules Card that we use for all our events. We have linked to it in the past, and you can always find it on our Chapter Website or in the weekly eBlast in the Quick Links section.



I want to highlight some important sections for all of our new members, especially if you are new to our Chapter or play in other clubs, as our Chapter may do some things differently.

The Gimme Section - The LPGA Amateurs San Diego Chapter is one of the only groups that allow gimmes for some of their events. Make sure to read this as well.

Maximum Score —There seems to be some confusion on posting your maximum score at Chapter events. The maximum gross score for each hole set by the Committee is **10**. You will play up to **10** strokes on a hole and, once reached, pick up your ball and record a **10** in Golf Genius. Do not stop at 8 strokes and record an 8X. This will disqualify you from the game of the day. When posting to GHIN, it will only post the max of Net Double Bogey (Par + 2 + any pops you have on the hole).

Scoring Procedures - Golf Genius allows us to Post scores for Players. Please note that you do NOT need to post your score after playing in one of our Chapter events. It will be done for you through Golf Genius.

As always, it is a great idea to print a hard copy of the Terms and Conditions and Local Rules Card to have with you at our Chapter events. To print the most recent February 08, 2023 version [CLICK HERE](#). Enjoy reviewing the Terms and Conditions and Local Rules on the next couple of pages.

LPGA Amateur Golf Association San Diego Chapter Terms of Competition and Local Rules (Hard Card)

The Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA govern play, supplemented by the following:

Pace of Play Policy:

Groups must play at a prompt pace and keep up with the group in front of them, finishing no more than 15 minutes behind the group ahead.

Your Group is BEHIND if:

- On a par 3, the group arrives at the tee after the group ahead has completed teeing off on the next hole.
- On a par 4, the group arrives at the tee, and the hole is empty.
- On a par 5, the group arrives at the tee, and the group ahead is on the putting green.

Groups that are out of position for any reason (ball searches, rules issues, etc.) are expected to return to position within no more than 2 holes. Groups that are behind may be subject to penalties under Rule 5.6.

It is recommended that the player make the stroke in no more than 40 seconds after she is (or should be) able to play without interference or distraction, and the player should usually be able to play more quickly than that.

Maximum Score: Under Rule 21.2, the maximum gross score for each hole set by the Committee is **10**. A player who does **NOT** hole out for any reason gets the maximum score for the hole. Once a player reaches 10 strokes on a hole, she should pick up to assist pace of play.

Additional Relief Option for Lost Ball or Out of Bounds: Model Local Rule E-5 is in effect. When a player's ball is lost or out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance (returning to the spot of the previous shot): For TWO penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping a ball within two club-lengths of the edge of the fairway nearest where the ball is determined to be lost or OB, no closer to the hole.

Relief from Sod Seams: Model Local Rule F-7. Player may take free relief under Rule 16.1 when a ball lies on a sod seam, or it interferes with the area of intended swing. No free relief for interference with the player's stance. Drop within 1 club length of the nearest point of complete relief, no closer to the hole.

Golf Clinics & Education *Continued...*

Aeration Holes: If the player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole, she may take free relief under Rule 16.1 as follows: in the General Area, the player may drop a ball within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief, no closer to the hole. On the putting green, the player may place a ball at the nearest point of complete relief. If the ball comes to rest in another aeration hole, the player may take relief again.

Preferred Lies (Winter Rules): Players will be notified prior to starting play if Preferred Lies is in effect. When a player's ball lies in the General Area cut to Fairway height or less (fairways and fringe of green only), the player may take relief once by placing the ball in the General Area within one club-length of where the ball lies, no closer to the hole.

Reminder on Rangefinders: Distance Measuring Devices such as GPS, smartphone apps, and range finders are permitted under the Rules, but if your device measures any other condition such as Slope or wind speed, that capability must be disabled or turned off.

Gimme Policy:

Although not in accordance with the Rules of Golf, for our routine play days (not major championships, qualifiers, or events), we do allow groups to agree to give putts (aka gimmes) within "the leather" (i.e., the length of the standard putter grip, **around 10.5 inches**). This makes the round more enjoyable, a little less competitive, and speeds play. Use of gimmes is not required, however.

Scoring Procedures:

We will be using the Golf Genius (GG) app for live scoring for all events.



Steps:

1. One person in the foursome will enter scores into the GG App.
2. Download the Golf Genius app if you don't already have it.
3. Open the app and sign in with your Team GGID, located on your scorecard and/or the tee sheet.
4. One other player will STILL need to keep a physical scorecard tracking the team's score.
5. At the end of the round, the person with the scorecard will read off the scores to the GG App scorer.
6. Then, the GG App scorer will read back to ensure accurate input.
7. This should take less than 5 minutes.
8. Once you have verified all scores and made any corrections, Press the Sandwich Menu  at the top left and log out. The scores are automatically uploaded to the tournament event in Golf Genius.
9. **Do not post to GHIN.** The Committee will post to GHIN for you after your round. GHIN will automatically post your score using Net Double Bogey.




Nancy Toennies


Natalie Hobson
