

ENGAGE. DISCOVER. LEARN.

November is **Native American Heritage Month**, when we commemorate and acknowledge everything our Native Americans have contributed throughout the years. With Thanksgiving only a couple weeks away, there is strong meaning behind this beloved holiday and we cannot forget the history the natives that have walked on this land before us created.

There are 573 federally recognized nations in the United States alone, but there are thousands of Native American nations that have their own cultures and traditions. One well-known tribe is called the Wampanoag. The Wampanoag (wom-puh-no-ah) Tribe, also known as “People of the First Light”, has been a federally recognized nation since 2007, but has inhabited Massachusetts and Eastern Rhode Island for over 12,000 years.

Their Native traditions, along with many other Native tribes, are deeply rooted with nature and learning how the environment has its own patterns in terms of weather, how the seasons affect plant life and water supply. With this knowledge, they were able to harvest their food and supplies even in the harshest of conditions. They also used what was naturally found in their environment to create their traditional clothing, jewelry, and practical and decorative objects, which is still in practice to this day.

All of this knowledge was helpful when they first interacted with the English colonists in 1620. Although there was probably curiosity and fear from both sides due to their vastly different cultures, each group learned much from one another. The Wampanoags shared their land, food, and environmental knowledge with the colonists to build a respectful, shared community.

The First Thanksgiving in 1621 between the Wampanoags and the English colonists was a celebration of their first autumn harvest. With the help of the Wampanoags' knowledge of the land, they feasted on local vegetables and fruits together for three days. Deer was presented to the chief Englishmen. Giving items of great importance, such as deer or bison, was a sign of respect and friendship between the two parties. (continues on page 5)

Unfortunately, their conflicting cultural perspectives grew and caused many conflicts of war that have crumbled Native American communities even to present day. Due to the increase of pollution, overharvesting, and the shrinking of wilderness habitats, Native American nations are not as widespread today. Although this has affected their way of food growth, many Native communities are currently finding ways to revive and continue on the traditional food practices of their ancestors.

There is no one, single Native American culture, and they are always adapting and changing. Their view of the Thanksgiving holiday is built from the relationship between human and nature. To give thanks back to the environment for being able to grow a variety of food is an integral part of their culture. The Charles County Public Library encourages you to think of the Wampanoags and their appreciation of the environment and the gifts it provides as you celebrate this holiday season, and focus on the gifts in your life that you are thankful for.


