We will hear the results of the recent countywide survey, the 3 community input sessions, interviews, and statewide research. Most importantly, we will hear firsthand the proposed plan forward for the arts in Charles County. 

Hope to see you next Tuesday, December 9, in La Plata!



County Commissioners of Charles County PROCLAMATION 2025-86

Charles County Arts and Culture Month

WHEREAS, the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, over 4,500 state agencies and councils, and over 110,000 nonprofit organizations, designated the month of October 2025 as National Arts and Humanities Month; and

WHEREAS, arts and humanities embody much of the accumulated wisdom, intellect, and imagination of humankind; and

WHEREAS, arts and humanities enhance and enrich the lives of every American - in our families, our communities, and our country; and

WHEREAS, the arts and culture industry also strengthens the U.S. economy - generating \$151.7 billion in annual total economic activity, \$29 billion in government revenue, 4.3% of the annual GDP, and the full-time equivalent of 5 million jobs nationwide; and

WHEREAS, since its inception in 1987, the mission of the Charles County Arts Alliance has been to promote ALL the arts in Charles County - the performing, visual and literary arts - which include music, drama, dance, visual arts and literature; and







Featured Solo Artist: Mylika "MJ" Radford at UMD Charles Regional Medical Center





Mid Atlantic Tours Roster Announced!

Mid Atlantic Tours brings performing arts ensembles to communities across the mid-Atlantic region, in partnership with [Ibermúsicas](#). Non-profit presenters in our region can book an artist from our annually-curated roster and receive grant support of up to 50% of the artist fee. This year's roster artists are: Las Áñez from Colombia and Fabiana Cozza from Brazil.

[Las Áñez](#) is a duo who blend folklore and the avant-garde. Both sisters sing on all their songs, half of which are composed and arranged by each of them, and they are the producers of their first three albums. Juanita plays the cuatro and percussion, and Valentina is a pianist and percussionist.

[Fabiana Cozza](#) is a singer and samba artist. She brings the ancient samba in her hands and in her voice, an echo from the terreiros where the old Afro traditions meet, the colors of Bahia and rhythm from the samba circles in Rio de Janeiro.


