Candle Making with Tiffany

Make six scented soy candles and several wax tarts from Southern Maryland's only candle making teacher, Tiffany Blues. She began six years ago perfecting her techniques and started offering classes last year. Each participant will receive a kit to keep which includes a reusable pouring pot, thermometer, 14 oz. of soy wax, containers for candles to be made during workshop, wicks, fragrance and instructions. Tiffany will also have other fragrances, wax and accessories for purchase after class. The registration price includes all supplies.

Students will be lead through all the stages of the painting process with demonstrations of how to create a dynamic grisaille, apply rich textures using a pallet knife and utilize critiques to improve composition. Some experience is desirable but not required. Oils or acrylics may be used. Bring photographs to work with and a sense of humor. (Handcrafted Ukrainian Eggs)

Mary Whitmore learned how to make Ukrainian painted eggs at the age of 8 from her Slovenian grandmother, a tradition she has carried on through today. Eggs are made with simple to complex designs using a wax stylus and dyes. Mary will teach simple Christmas designs and then convert them to hanging ornaments if preferred. Painted eggs are traditionally given to friends, neighbors and religious leaders as a symbol for rebirth, resurrection and a good harvest. A \$5.00 fee will be paid to the instructor for a Ukrainian egg decorating kit that will include many designs, stylus, wax and dyes to make further eggs as desired.


