When you are the parent of child with Down syndrome, you get used to people staring at you and your child everywhere that you go. You can feel 'othered'. But there we felt none of that - we felt just like everybody else.

John continued, "During one of the sessions, our son Kaleb was having meltdown and I was in the hallway trying to soothe and calm him down. Usually, we would be alone in this feel circumstance and judged. But this time there were other parents and kids doing the exact same thing. So there was no judgment, and I was able to parent and support Kaleb without the additional burdens that normally accompany these situations. Looking back, I am glad I was able to experience that when our son was only 8 years old. Kaleb is now 20 and the past 12 years of parenting have been changed for the better due to those experiences."

"At the conference I had the opportunity to meet Chris Burke, actor and singer who played Charles "Corky" Thatcher on the television series 'Life Goes On.' I am generally not someone to get starstruck, but it was so impactful to meet and be in the presence of someone



who so well represented our community in such a public and positive way. Burke took time with each attendee vying for his attention -- it was a beautiful thing to witness. There was an extraordinary sense of joy in his simple act of kindness and encouragement." John noted.
