INSIGHT INTO TODAY'S READINGS

St. Bartholomew, Apostle

Christ's preachers are not to be great lords, but servants who faithfully stay with Christ in His trials (Luke 22:24–30). They are "jars of clay"; the Savior they preach is the "surpassing power" (2 Cor. 4:7). Christ's servants are "afflicted in every way," "always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested" there (2 Cor. 4:8–10). On the foundation of their prophetic and apostolic confession, the Church is built, "joined together" by Christ, "the cornerstone" (Eph. 2:20–21). As an apostle (Luke 6:13–14), Bartholomew manifested "the Son of God" in his preaching and his death. Christ is the "Son of Man" — the King Who opens heaven to us by His wounds (John 1:49–51). We bear sufferings not leaning "on [our] own understanding," but trusting in the Lord (Prov. 3:5–7). Life will be manifested in our bodies, too, when the Lord brings "healing to [our] flesh and refreshment to [our] bones" in the resurrection (Prov. 3:8).

- Almighty God in His Mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the 🕂 Son and of the Holy Spirit. (John 20:19-23)





NICENE CREED (spoken in unison)

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. 


PREFACE


THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION

HOLY COMMUNION

Receiving Holy Communion

As Lutheran Christians, we believe, teach, and confess that Jesus Christ gives us His own true Body and Blood via the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper (1 Cor. 10:16). We trust His promise that this Supper is for the forgiveness of our sins, the increase of our faith, and the strengthening of our life as the Church. Baptized Christians who share our confession, repent of their sins, and seek the Lord's blessing are welcome to receive. First time guests are kindly asked to speak to our pastor or an usher before receiving communion. Those not communing are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.


[For silent prayer before communing]


