The summit provided an unforgettable experience by giving high school students access to mentors and the opportunity to work together and innovate.

Over the course of three days, students were introduced to the Design Thinking/Lean Start-Up model. Each team was challenged with identifying a specific problem within the food waste realm and creating an innovative solution that addressed that problem. With the guidance of team mentors, workshop facilitators and consultants, each team developed solutions that they ultimately pitched Shark Tank-style.

Throughout the summit, students participated in mini-workshops and challenges that developed both technical skills and soft skills. These skills are not only important to being a successful entrepreneur but also prepare students to meet the demands of a rapidly changing economy in a variety of professions and careers.
