### **Prayer of Confession**

Forgive us, Lord. We have taken your creation into our hands not to love and steward, but to use and then discard. Forgive us, Lord. We have sought you most often when we wanted something from you, rather than for the joy of being in relationship with you. Forgive us, Lord. We ask now for your mercy. We seek your forgiveness. We knock in anticipation that you will hear us in spite of our failings. We pray in Jesus' name.**

Silent Confession

Assurance of Pardon

When we ask with humility, when we seek with all our hearts, when we knock in faith, God is faithful to forgive us and restore us to new life in Jesus Christ.

**God redeems all that is lost, wounded, and selfish in us, giving us new life and a new start. Thanks be to God! Amen.**
