Please remain seated and join me in our Advent Candle Lighting Liturgy:

The Prophet Isaiah tells us about the joy of coming into God's presence. The prophet tells us to imagine being set free, being unburdened, being released to fully live in the grace and wonder of life itself, surrounded by those who love us. And then he tells us that the journey to get there is just as much a joy as the destination.

“The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus. It shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. . . .A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way. . . It shall be for God's people. And the ransomed of the LORD shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall be no more.” (Isaiah 35:1-2, 8, 10).

We light these candles, the candles of joyous hope, of proclaimed peace, and of deep and everlasting joy, as a sign that we are those who walk with a skip in our step because God's presence is both destination and joyous journey.
