Prayer of Confession

Presence, Life, Breath, God who is Three in One, we confess that, though we are made in your image, we distort the triune life. Instead of seeking mutual welfare and the common good, we seek our own gain. Instead of living in equality, justice, and respect, we construct systems that are unjust. We speak words and devise ways to elevate ourselves over others. We allow differences to divide us. Holy Trinity, forgive us. Restore in us, and in our life together, the divine image you intend. Make us tender in mutuality. Make us generous in equality. Make us grateful in diversity. In the name of Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit, we ask it.
