

Call to Worship

Please stand as you are led and join me in our responsive Call to Worship:
Followers of Jesus, by his cross we are redeemed from the futility of sin.

Call to Confession (Liturgist)

When we keep our fears and faults hidden within, we can't be healed and receive new life. Therefore, let us open ourselves to God in confession, trusting the Lord's desire to give us peace. Let us pray together...

Prayer of Confession

God of the empty tomb and our empty hearts, when we are afraid to speak our faith, forgive us and help us to find our voice. When we are afraid to forgive and to love again, forgive us and grant us faith in the power of mercy. When we are afraid to stand up for the weak, forgive us and make us strong. When we are afraid to live in the power of your resurrection, touch us with your wounded hands and set us free. When we are locked behind our doubts and fears, pass through our barricades, open our hearts, and give us peace.

Silent Confession

Assurance of Pardon

Christ comes with healing into our locked places of hurt and fear, resurrecting our spirits, opening to us the truth, and breathing into us new life. Friends, receive the gift of Christ's mercy.

As God's forgiven people, we receive life, peace, and joy in place of our fear. Alleluia! Amen.

Response: Alleluia, Alleluia! Give thanks to the risen Lord. Alleluia, Alleluia, Give praise to His name. (Refrain only)

Prayer for Illumination

(Liturgist)

Let us prepare our hearts to hear God's Word by praying together the prayer for Illumination:

Holy God, as we bow our heads beneath the cross, pour out your Spirit upon us, that we might trust in your power to bring peace out of tragedy, salvation out of suffering, victory out of defeat, life out of death. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.

Scripture Reading

Luke 24: 36-48

³⁶ While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷ They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate in their presence.

⁴⁴ Then he said to them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.” ⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶ and he said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things.

This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
