

The City of Toronto will be repairing sidewalks, roadway, and milling & paving of Yonge St starting in June, 2020. The boundaries of the work are from Gerrard St to King St. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repairs to bring it to a state of good repair.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. 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|  | <p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with property owners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p> |
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OTHER IMPORTANT DETAILS

Property owners in the construction area are advised to remove any items installed or planted beyond the private property line and in the City-owned right-of-way that may impact construction. If you have a lawn sprinkler system located within City property, please contact the Inspector to arrange for a site inspection.

The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on City property.

Street furniture (planters, bike parking, benches, information pillars, etc.) located within the construction work area will also be temporarily removed.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.

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|  | <p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p> |
|  | <p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p> |

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|  | Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. |
|  | <p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>You may park outside of the construction work zone. Please arrange to park elsewhere on streets that allow on-street parking and be aware of parking restrictions on the street.</p> <p>If you receive a ticket for on-street parking during this period, please immediately contact the Inspector listed below within three days, so that your ticket can be cancelled.</p> <p>Please note: Parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones), or if they are submitted no later than three days after receipt.</p> <p><i>Please leave a copy of this notice face up on the dashboard so that it is visible to Parking Enforcement Officers.</i></p> |
|  | <p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p> |
|  | <p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing time during the season - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p> <p><i>We request homeowners to water the new sod in front of their property to ensure proper growth.</i></p> |
|  | Residents that require accommodation must contact the City Inspector to arrange for access during the construction period. |
