

In 1981 Eliza Edmunds Hewitt was born and grew to be valedictorian of her class and a school teacher in Pennsylvania. At some point in her teaching career a student struck her on the back with a piece of heavy slate. This left Eliza in a heavy cast for months, confined to her room.

During this time of painful confinement, Eliza was determined not to be bitter and started writing hymns. Many of them were praise hymns such as "Stepping in the Light," "Singing I Go," "Victory in Jesus" and many more.

When she was able to go outside for the first time on a spring day, she enjoyed the warmth of the sun. Returning to her room with a joyful heart, she wrote "Sunshine in My Soul Today."

Eliza did improve but suffered health problems for the rest of her life. She went on to do work in various Sunday School capacities, a passion of hers. At one time she had a class numbering 200.

Eliza Hewitt is remembered for the great hymns that have brought comfort to many people. Had she not suffered this terrible injury, these hymns that speak to our hearts might not ever been written.

## Finance Committee Report



As of July 31st, the Church was ten months through its current fiscal year, which runs from October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020. Year-to-date results at July 31st were:

Church Expenses	\$396,541
<b>Church receipts greater than expenses</b>	<b>\$172,678</b>
Receipts from Preschool	\$67,817
PreSchool Expenses	\$73,704
<b>Preschool expenses greater than receipts</b>	<b>-\$5,887</b>

The net results for the church continue to run favorable compared to the prior year, primarily due to increased contributions and lower expenses due to open ministerial positions and elimination of the debt payment.

## Rusty's Rap Session

---



I want to devote this month's article/devotional to our young people. I mean those people between adolescence and 30 years old. Luke 2:52 states that Jesus grew in "wisdom, and in stature, in favor with God and in favor with man." Being that this is the only statement about his life from adolescence through age 30, I think this verse deserves discussion and investigation. If we believe that He is who he said He was; i.e. the creator of the universe who walked the earth in human form; then, spending some time and study dedicated to that one verse is justified. Let us focus on the word, **Favor**. It is defined in Webster's dictionary as: friendly regard shown toward another especially by a superior; approving consideration; partiality. When one has favor one is rendered preferential treatment.

I am not leaving out the other descriptive words that explain his maturing in "wisdom" and in "stature". Naturally a young person who attends school and eats a healthy diet, exercises and who has not yet reached adulthood, if that person continues on a productive path he or she will certainly grow in "wisdom" and in "stature". Those tend to occur naturally as one progresses through life as long as one does the right things to gain both "wisdom" and "stature". On the other hand "favor" is earned. Favor occurs when someone consistently behaves or performs in a positive and productive manner and when one shows oneself to be trust worthy. Favor happens when an employee shows up to work every day on time and performs the required duties and tasks to the best possible quality of performance with standards of excellence. Favor can be granted, but most often it is earned. I believe this is the type of favor that "increased" in the life of Jesus as a young adult.

When a person, any person, begins the process of seeking a career upon graduation from High School, college or graduate school, they are effectively starting the path to becoming a productive part of society. Some will become employees, some will become employers. Some will become teachers, doctors, lawyers, welders, painters, carpenters, and plumbers, skilled and unskilled laborers. Some will become soldiers, sailors, airmen or air women. The point is everyone starts out on their own path and everyone needs assistance. No one ever attained anything in life without the help of someone else. That help comes from people who generally are more knowledgeable than us and who mentor us or teach us the things necessary to progress forward. We all need to have favor from our teachers, mentors, managers and family members. Over the course of my life personally, I have found that seeking out knowledge or assistance from a superior (teacher, professor, manager, etc.) in any form has placed me in a favorable position of that person or those persons. Any time I have ever sought out knowledge, the knowledgeable person was always gracious and willing to help. Attitude is everything and having a teachable spirit will always place a person in a favorable position in the eyes of mentors, teachers, employers, etc. Jesus increased in favor. In other words he made a conscious effort to obtain more favor from God and more favor from men. As a young man he sought to please God the Father and fulfilled the requirements of scripture, thus increasing in favor with God. James writes....."draw near to God and He will draw near to you" (4:8). In other words as we draw near to God we seek His favor and in that favor He draws near to us. Jesus stated in Mark 10:45, "I have come not to be served, but to serve...." If that is the attitude that He had as a young man, and I am certain it was, then He would certainly increase in favor with other people. As Jesus grew in wisdom, in stature and in favor with God and in favor with other people he was earning respect and the right to be heard. What do I mean by that?

We increase in favor because we are living our lives in public as an example of God's grace on display. (By the way, that is what Jesus did and is also what is require of us.) We are earning the right to be heard. No one will listen to someone whom they do not favor. An employer will not listen to a bad employee. A teacher will not listen to a stubborn student. I have a hard time really listening to a person that I do not respect, but if someone has earned my respect, then I favor that person. I have regard toward them and I will listen. Moses had the favor of God, he earned it and God listened to him. Abraham had God's favor because God knew his character and God revealed things to him. I encourage you to purposefully seek the favor of God and of people that can positively affect your life. Favor can only be obtained by humbly seeking the assistance of God and the assistance of others.
