There was a great turn out and wonderful weather. I want to thank our deacon celebration team for all your hard work in planning and implementing this event.

Chesterfest was on September 28th. We opened up our parking lot and provided free parking. We also provided a shuttle to take people to and from ChesterFest. We passed out cold water and information about our church. Lots of people were really surprised at our level of hospitality and it was a lot of fun.

Also, on September 28th the deacons hosted a **Widow, Widower and Single Senior's Banquet**. This has become a really special annual event to show our love and appreciation for these wonderful members of our church. We had a catered meal followed by entertainment from Randy McConnell and Ann Totty.

September was a great month of fellowship — Bible Study (Wednesday nights & Sunday mornings), Meals (community fellowship meal, backpack program, church picnic, widow-widower banquet), and hospitality to the broader community (ChesterFest and community fellowship meal). Rusty's Rap Session

Who is Jesus?

So often we hear the question, "Who is Jesus?" Or we hear, "Who is Jesus to you?" Those questions have been posed from the moment in Bethlehem that the Christ Child was born. To be completely honest, there are few questions as important as this one; that is if Jesus really is the Only Way to have eternal life? I believe that is the truth, so my writing and everything that I do revolves around the fact that He is exactly who He said He was! In the Gospel of John 14:6, it is recorded that Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life: no one comes to the Father but by me."

Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15). Simon Peter said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Jesus went on to tell Peter that God the Father had revealed this to him, and that he was blessed because of that revelation. One of the purposes that we have as believers is to reveal who Jesus truly is. If we are truly born again, the Father has revealed to us, just as He did to Peter, that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God.

We must ask ourselves, Who do we say that He is? Is He Savior? Is He Lord? Is He the Waymaker? Is he the peace that passes understanding? Is He the overcomer of death, hell and the grave? Is He the healer of hearts and bodies? Is He the mender of wounds? Is He a father to the fatherless? Is He the mediator that is always on our side? I ASSERT TO YOU THAT HE IS ALL OF THOSE THINGS AND MORE. Jesus Christ is the One sent by the Father to make up for all of our imperfections, no matter how bad they may be. That is who He is to me!

My obligation to Him, my responsibility as a Christian, is to live my life in such a manner that "who He truly is" is made plain and obvious in how I live my life. In that way, my manner of living, not simply what I say, truly reveals who Jesus is. Because what I do and how I live speaks so much louder and has so much more meaning than what I say. That's how it is for all of us.

We who call ourselves Christians, if we truly are saved, if we truly are his; are obligated to follow "The Way, The Truth and The Life". The reason for doing that is so as we follow Him, as "The Way" He will guide not only us, but will also help guide all of those in our sphere of influence toward the correct direction. As "The Truth" He will help us to separate truth from falsehood; we will not be easily deceived and we will not deceive others. As "The Life" He will make us the overcomers that we are called to be. As we are able to live overcoming lives, we gain the ability and we earn the right to be heard by others as they see that we live life as they do, but we have something different. We have hope when there seems to be no reason to hope. We have joy, even in the midst of sorrow. We know that God makes something out of nothing, so we are never at a loss. We may have evidence of nothing, but we have a real sense of having everything because we are not alone. The Maker of Everything, holds us in His hand and we are His. That is who He Is!

Bulletins of the 1950s give the secular celebration Halloween a passing mention, usually just a children's costume party on the last Sunday before the holiday.



The real focus centered on spiritual revival and rededication, as well as emphasizing faithful stewardship in the beginning of a new fiscal year.

Rev. Inge led the work to construct our physical church without losing sight of the Christian fellowship that built our church family. He declared, "Life takes on new meaning when we dedicate ourselves to our church; and the spirit of giving with a free heart is certainly one of greatest importance in the forward march for His Kingdom." Approaching the church's 50th anniversary, he urged members to help meet financial goals in the building fund, but he also included some timely advice: "Let us resolve to love more...[to] pray and WORK every day to do our utmost to glorify Christ by our faithfulness and our dependability." [emphasis original]

So, in a month now overflowing with Halloween candy and pumpkins, ghosts and ghouls, and other things that go bump in the night, take a moment to reflect on our future goals for Chester Baptist Church in the upcoming year. Rev. Inge understood the fundamental importance of re-orienting our priorities along spiritual guidelines as he concluded, "We need to be reminded of the great love and devotion God has for us." More than sixty years later, we are still building our church family, practicing the faithful stewardship we hold in trust, and the open-hearted giving we received as a spiritual legacy to carry forward into a New Year.....now, just as they did then.....
