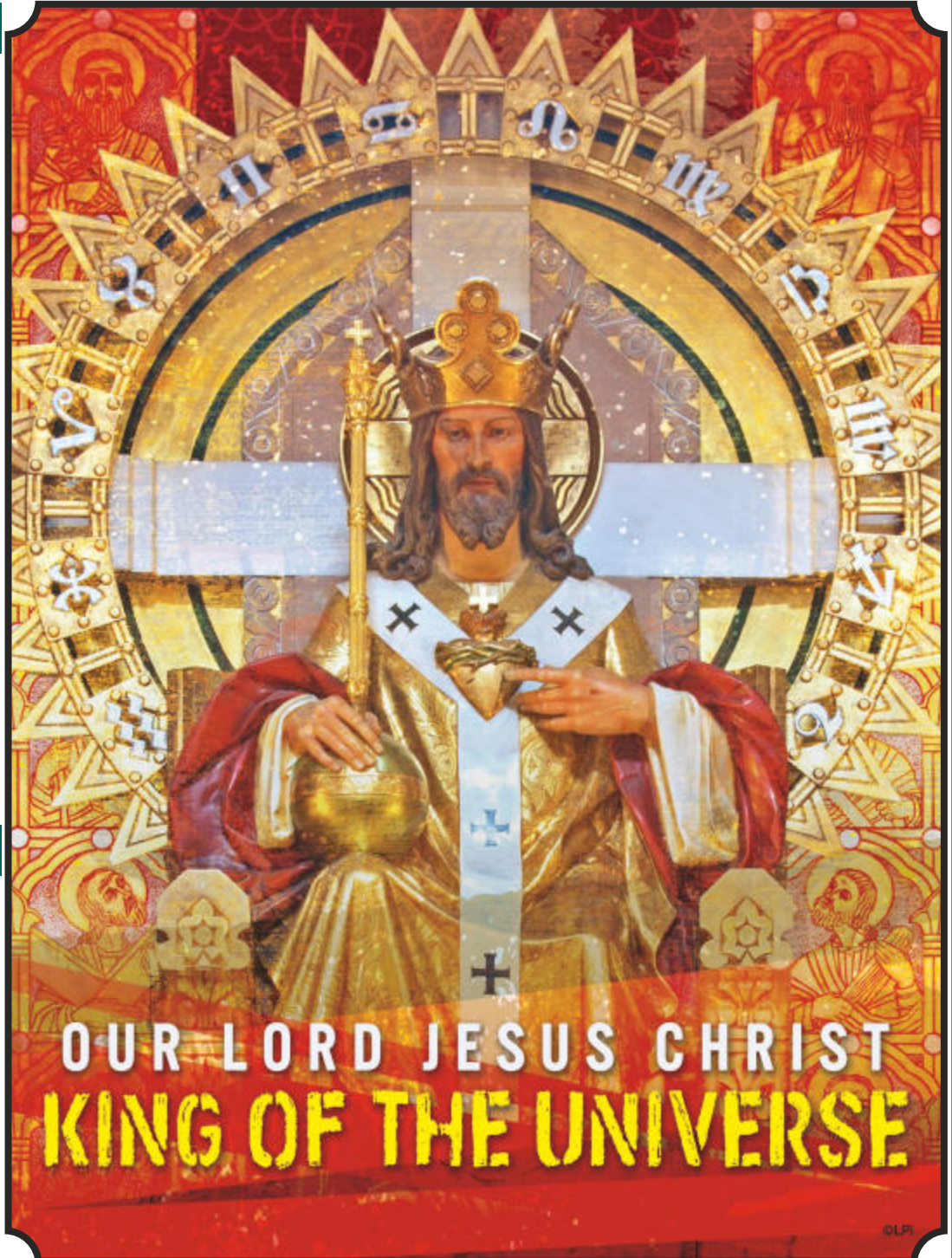

### Dear Parishioners and School Families:



I thought I would take this opportunity to share with each of you how grateful and thankful I have been with the opening of this unusual school year. During this pandemic year, St. Teresa School has been able to open with in-person learning as well as remote learning for families that choose to do so. Our opening has been possible due to several reasons. First, having an active school board and dedicated teachers who planned all summer for the anticipated school opening in August. Second, being fortunate enough to have Dr. Mike Nash as our School Board President. He has been tremendously helpful assisting our families and school when asked about following the guidelines provided by the CDC and IDPH with regards to Covid. Third, the school families that have been extremely supportive and have worked continuously to follow the guidelines that seem to change on a weekly basis with regards to Covid.

However, the greatest gift has come from a couple of individuals from our parish cluster who have donated money from their state taxes through Empower Illinois or have contributed to the Adopt-a-Student Program through church. Six donors were able to direct \$36,000.00 of their state taxes into Empower Illinois which fully funded the tuition of 8 of our students. We had 3 members each from St. Luke Church and St. Teresa Church donate a total of \$28,100.00 to the Adopt-a-Student tuition assistance fund. These funds were distributed between 14 students to help partially pay their school tuition. Additionally, the St. Luke's St. Vincent de Paul group donated \$4,200.00 to pay for one student's tuition. When you look at our school enrollment of 214 students, our St. Luke and St. Teresa parishioners assisted 21 students to attend our school.

When I look at being thankful at this time of the year, these are the blessings God has shared with me and our school. Thank you to everyone for your support! Please stay safe and have a "different" kind of Thanksgiving, but know that all of us have something to be thankful for!!

**Respect Life Corner** - In Matthew's Gospel, Matthew 25:31 -46 Jesus talks to his disciples in the form of a simple story: a shepherd separating animals at the end of the day in the Middle East. The sheep and goat tend to mingle easily with one another -until the end. The sheep represent those who will share eternal life with Christ, the goats represent those who will suffer eternal punishment. Jesus tells the disciples that however you treated the least of people, you treated me. This highlights the significance that we are Jesus's arms, his voice, his heart and we are his co-workers in the kingdom on earth.

**Learn, Act, Connect and Pray** - let's use this time to examine our lives as we listen to the readings that represent the end of the Liturgical year. How are we doing? Are we providing for those who are in prison by writing letters of encouragement through our diocese pen pal ministry through Prison Ministry? Are we getting involved in Respect Life efforts in our diocese to help the abortion vulnerable as well as the marginalized? We must look at and respect the dignity of all human life -in every stage and situation- and then we will know we are working for Christ.

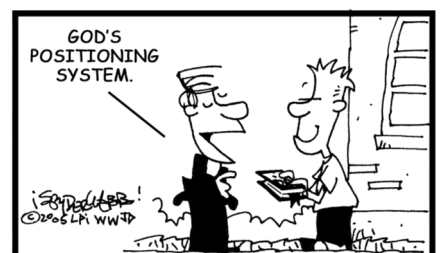

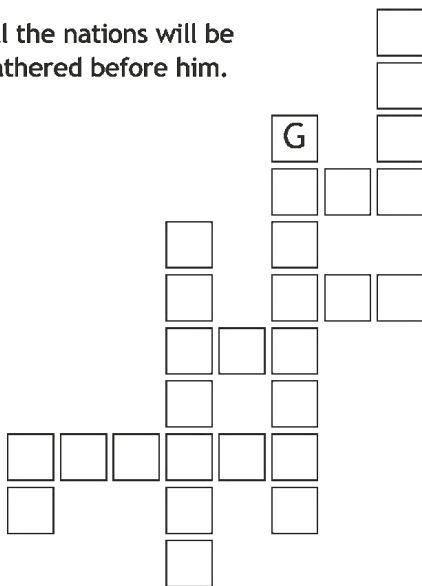

## The "it" number

On a Sunday evening in Baltimore a few years ago, a woman named Eva was invited to speak at a program sponsored by several churches and a local synagogue and mosque. Eva was warm and soft-spoken, kind and gracious. She came to tell her story of surviving the Holocaust.

As she told her story, it was hard to imagine how this woman could be mistreated by anyone. Hers was a normal, safe and secure childhood. She and her family happily lived their Jewish faith in Germany during the first half of the 20th century. Then everything changed with the rise of the Nazi regime.

Eva started to tell about life in the camps — and when she raised her hand to make a gesture, her sleeve dropped a bit and the audience saw it: a number tattooed on her elegant arm.

Bishop Michael Curry recounts the moment in his new book **Love Is the Way**.

Bishop Curry, now the presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church in the United States, was the rector of one of the Baltimore churches that sponsored the program. He writes that seeing the tattoo made him shudder.

"And now that I was truly feeling the horror, my rational mind kept asking *how*: How could anyone do such evil to anyone else, to any child of God, to any human being, let alone this gentle creature sitting in front of me. *How . . . ?*

" . . . when Eva raised her hand and that sleeve dropped, exposing that tattoo, I was speechless. I had seen pictures, but this was the first time I had seen the numbers up close, on the frail arm of a hand I had gently shaken. It hit me as never before: That tattoo was who and what she was to her captors. A number. A thing. An object. An 'it.' That number rendered her an 'it.' And when a person, a child of God, my sister, my brother, my sibling become an 'it' to society or its members, then the unthinkable becomes thinkable and the horrible possible."

The reign of Christ begins when we see one another as Christ — not as a "number," not as a "mark," not as the means to our own end, not as an "it." The true value of every human life is the light that God kindles within each one of us; our worth is found in the love of God that our lives reveal to the world. Before God, no one is an "it." Jesus' parable in today's Gospel challenges us to see one another in that light: to look deeper than the externals of race, nationality, culture and language in order to behold the love of God animating the lives of all of us in whom God has breathed his love and life.
