

Preparing Before Lent Begins

Taking some time to get ready for Lent will ensure that we aren't going to miss the first week or two of Lent, because we are just getting started. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, but we want to be ready to really take off on that day, rather than just beginning to think about Lent on that day. Part of what makes a vacation or a special anniversary so special is the build-up to it.



Before we get to Ash Wednesday, we should start asking ourselves some questions and we should start with some preparations. "What does God want to give me this year?" This question may require that I slow down a bit and listen to my inner spirit. For example, even if I'm very busy, I realize I'm hungry when I hear my stomach start "growling." "What am I going to be doing on Ash Wednesday?" Too often, Ash Wednesday is like every other day, except that I manage to get to church and get ashes on my forehead. Is there anything else I can do on Ash Wednesday? How will fasting and abstaining happen for me, for my family on that special day?

It doesn't take a lot of time to prepare for the beginning of Lent. It just takes desire and focus. God can do so much with that. We can give God more of a space to touch our hearts if we begin to establish some simple patterns. We could wake up each morning, and for something like a half a minute to a minute, stand by the edge of our beds, and just ask the Lord for the grace to let this day be one in which I long for the beginning of Lent. Perhaps we need to ask for specific helps or graces to get ready to begin Lent. Whatever we try to say, our Lord can understand the Spirit trying to speak through our simple words. And all it takes is the time to find and put on our slippers. And each night, in the days ahead, we can practice giving thanks to God before I go to bed. This simple pattern, in the morning and evening can stir our spirits to look forward to and prepare for Lent, as a season of grace.

May our Lord bless us all on this journey ahead.

March, 2022 - January, 2023.**


Tickets will be \$25 for 1, or \$100 for 5.

"Connections" of transfiguration

Two Christmases ago — the first COVID Christmas — their grandson was only a year old. With contact limited because of the pandemic, they feared that they would be just another masked figure shivering in their driveway, another face on the computer screen. Would he recognize them when they could finally hug him again? But this past Christmas, their grandson, now two, recognized his grandparents and was delighted to see them.

When the little boy patted the floor for Grandma to sit next to him, her heart "ping[ed]." The grandmother, Boston Globe columnist Joan Vennochi, writes [December 23, 2021] that, while she and her family will continue to act safely and responsibly for the good of all, "I never want to return to driveway visits. I don't want to go back in time to when I couldn't chase after this little boy and wipe his face after a joyous encounter with ice cream or pick up his new baby brother. FaceTime has its moments, but it's not the same as pushing him in a swing or catching him at the end of the slide."

"That craving for human contact makes us human. The fear of losing it again may be the biggest hurdle when it comes to fighting this pandemic. We need people, whatever our political beliefs and whatever phase of life we're in. We need the friend who comes over for a glass of wine, the daughter who shows up to help with a computer problem, and the grandchildren who jubilantly disturb the empty nest. We even need our office mates, and not just for the energy of their ideas, but for the snippets about their lives outside work that are shared while waiting in the Starbucks line."

As this pandemic grinds along, Joan Vennochi writes, "so much divides us and pulls us apart. That's why every connection is so precious . . . I am grateful for the gift of a little boy who reaches out to grab my hand and, with his brother, touches my heart."

The late Archbishop Desmond Tutu said that "God places us in the world as God's fellow workers — agents of transfiguration. We work with God so that injustice is transfigured into justice, so that there will be more compassion and caring, so that there will be more laughter and joy, so that there will be more togetherness in God's world." The joy experienced in a two-year-old grandson's hug is such a moment of transfiguration: when the love and care we possess "transfigures" brokenness, isolation and grief into trust, healing and acceptance. As we've come to appreciate all the more during these difficult two years, these simple expressions of welcome and care "transfigure" the human experience into meaning and purpose. The figure of Christ on Mount Tabor calls us to be what Desmond Tutu called "agents of transfiguration": to take on the work of transforming the coldness, sadness and despair around us into the love, compassion and hope of God.
