3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is — the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch us and change us. It can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainty of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. We will be more aware of the sacred and the holy and less invested in things that pull us away. ©LPi



St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28



One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "*The Summa Theologiae*." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. *The Summa Theologiae*, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today. ©LPi

Hi all! My name is Nancy Polen and I am looking for anyone interested in participating in a Prayer Shawl Ministry at St. Teresa.

Your participation would include prayer for and knitting, crocheting or no sew shawls/wraps for people of our community. Shawls can be used for: undergoing medical procedures; as a comfort after a loss or in times of stress; during bereavement; prayer or meditation; marriage ceremonies; a birth or baby shower; bridal shower or wedding gift; during an illness and recovery; ministering to others; graduation, birthday, or a special anniversary. When creating a prayer shawl the individual making it begins with a recipient in mind. This person is held in the crafter's thoughts from beginning to end. The maker of the shawl is encouraged to compose a prayer to accompany the shawl when it is presented. Then whenever the recipient wears the shawl they have a tangible reminder of the care and prayers directed their way.

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10. Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15.

1 Corinthians 12:12-30. Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21.

Believing the Word of God. We are the Body of Christ (Corinthians) assembling as the graced community of believers (Nehemiah) each week to give thanks and praise, to share in Communion, and then sent to serve. We are part of the great Communion of Saints to whom is handed down the living Word of God – both the Scriptures and the Tradition as well as the very person of Christ who is the spoken Word of God (Luke). During the first Mass in a brand-new church building, the bishop shows the Lectionary to the assembly and says:

"May the word of God resound always in this building,
to open for you the mystery of Christ
and to bring about your salvation in the Church."

- ◆ How will I set aside a few minutes each day to read/reread Scripture? What is a good time?
- ◆ How will I look for the unfolding mystery of Christ in little and big ways today?
- ◆ How will I be "good news" this week by what I say and do?



World Marriage Day

Archbishop Rozanski will celebrate a Mass for World Marriage Day at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, 4431 Lindell Blvd. St. Louis, MO, on **February 13, 2022 at 2:30 pm**. All married couples are invited to attend and celebrate the gift of marriage. World Marriage Day honors husband and wife as the foundation of the family – the basic unit of society. It emphasizes the faithfulness, sacrifice and joy of daily married life. World Marriage Day started in Baton Rouge, LA in 1981 and was later adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter who now is sponsoring this event on February 13th.

"As a seal upon your heart . . ."

It was one of the toughest challenges in his ministry: officiating at the funeral a young woman who died at the age of 24 from a contaminated drug injection. What do you say in the face of such indescribable tragedy? He preached on the words from the Song of Solomon, *Set me as a seal upon your heart, a seal upon your arm; for love is strong as death.* Our faith as Christians is stronger than death, he said. Our hope is simply that we are "sealed" upon God's heart.

The priest always wondered if his words had made any difference to the woman's grieving family.

Then he received an extraordinary message from the woman's father. He wrote that at his daughter's funeral, "her brother was so upset that I wondered whether he'd taken much from it. For the rest of that summer, he withdrew from us and from most people. Some weeks later he acquired, on the inside of his right forearm, an indecipherable tattoo. It turned out that he'd asked my wife, in her beautiful handwriting, to write eight short words, which he then had permanently tattooed in mirror image. He decided on a mirror image, he said, 'because I don't want people knowing my business.' The eight words were: *Set me as a seal upon your heart.*"

The priest, Rev. Samuel Wells, the vicar of St. Martin-in-the-Fields Church in London and former Dean of Duke University Chapel, tells the story in an essay in **The Christian Century** [January 29, 2020]. He writes that at first, he didn't know how to respond to the father's letter.

"How can we know what ministry truly means to people since we so seldom ask them to roll up their sleeves and provide the evidence? But what I know is this: Christ rolls up his sleeves in ministry around Galilee. In Jerusalem he rolls up his sleeves and bares his arm and shows us that love is strong as death, passion as fierce as the grave."

If the Holy Spirit provides the vision of what it means "to be set as a seal upon Christ's heart, like a tattoo upon his arm," Wells writes, "then all I can do us roll up my sleeves and say, bring it on."

All of us, at one time or another, doubt we can realize the good we are called to do. We don't think we can measure up to the expectations of others — and we're not sure we want to. We struggle to make sense of our lives and to understand what we want to make of them. Isaiah's vision read by Jesus in today's Gospel includes us: the Spirit of God "is upon" us, too, leading us to the other side of doubt, setting us to the work of creating God's Kingdom here and now, enabling us to see our lives and world illuminated with the peace and hope of our Creator. As Jesus realizes his identity in the Spirit of God at his baptism, we find our identity in that Spirit at our baptisms, as well.
